

INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS Bathtub Drain with Overflow Hole

Need Tools:




Note:

If you are replacing the drain on an existing floor-mounted free-standing tub, you may need to remove the tub from the floor. Additionally, clean the silicone caulking around the tub before lifting it for drain replacement.

INSTALLATION:

- 1. Remove the Old Drain: Carefully flip the tub over. Use pliers to loosen the locknut, or insert a dumbbell drain wrench from the backside of the drain and turn clockwise to loosen.
- 2. Detach the Old Drain: Remove the old drain by loosening the locknut and washer
- 3. Clean the Area: Thoroughly clean the area around the tub's drain hole and the bottom surface of the tub. Ensure all silicone caulking is completely removed. If needed, a mixture of vinegar and baking soda can be used for effective cleaning.
- 4. Apply New Caulking: Apply a new layer of silicone caulking on the tapered surface above the drain hole and on the bottom surface of the tub beneath the drain hole.
- 5. Install the New Drain: Insert the new drain (part #1) with washer (part #2) into the drain hole from the top of the tub.
- Secure the Drain: From the underside of the tub. insert washer (part #3) and thread the locknut (part #4). Use pliers, an adjustable wrench or the dumbbell drain wrench from the backside of the drain and turn counterclockwise to tighten.
- the on/off operation.





Failure to follow all directions may cause leaks which may result in water damage

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
