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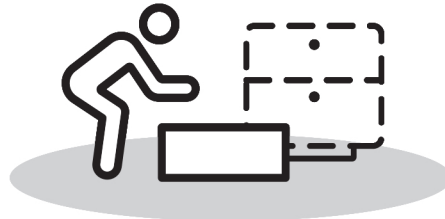
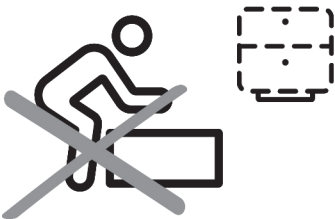
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ALWAYS have at least two people to help with transporting and assembling the product to avoid potential injury and/or damage.



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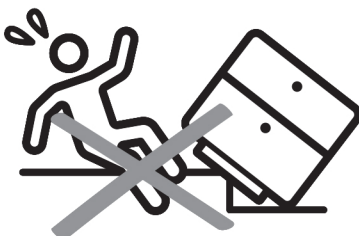
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Make sure you have enough space to move around during the assembly.



Avoid Scratches

Use cardboard, blankets or a carpeted area while assembling furniture to prevent to prevent scratches and damages.



Flat Surface

Make sure the furniture rests on a flat and level surface with each leg evenly touching the floor.

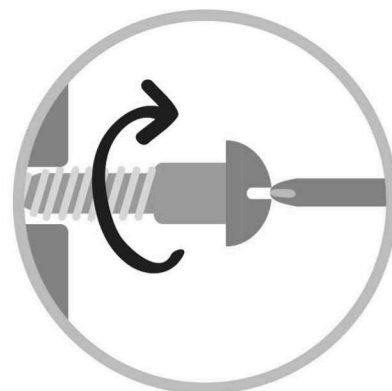

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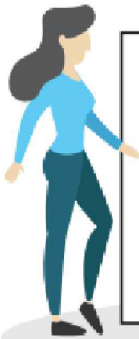
Save the instructions and store

maintenance.



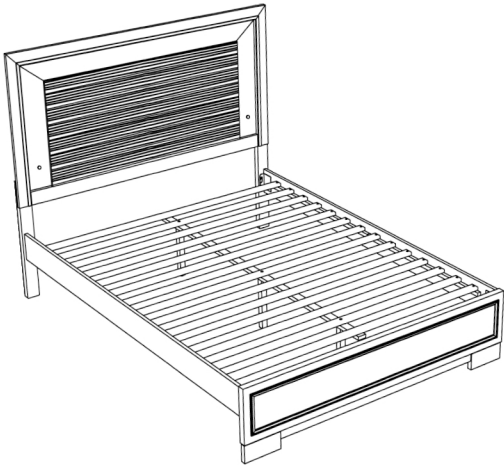
After two weeks, check and

Align the headboard Leg (#3) to the Headboard (#1) and secure by using bolt assembly of (#B) with Washers (#C, D).

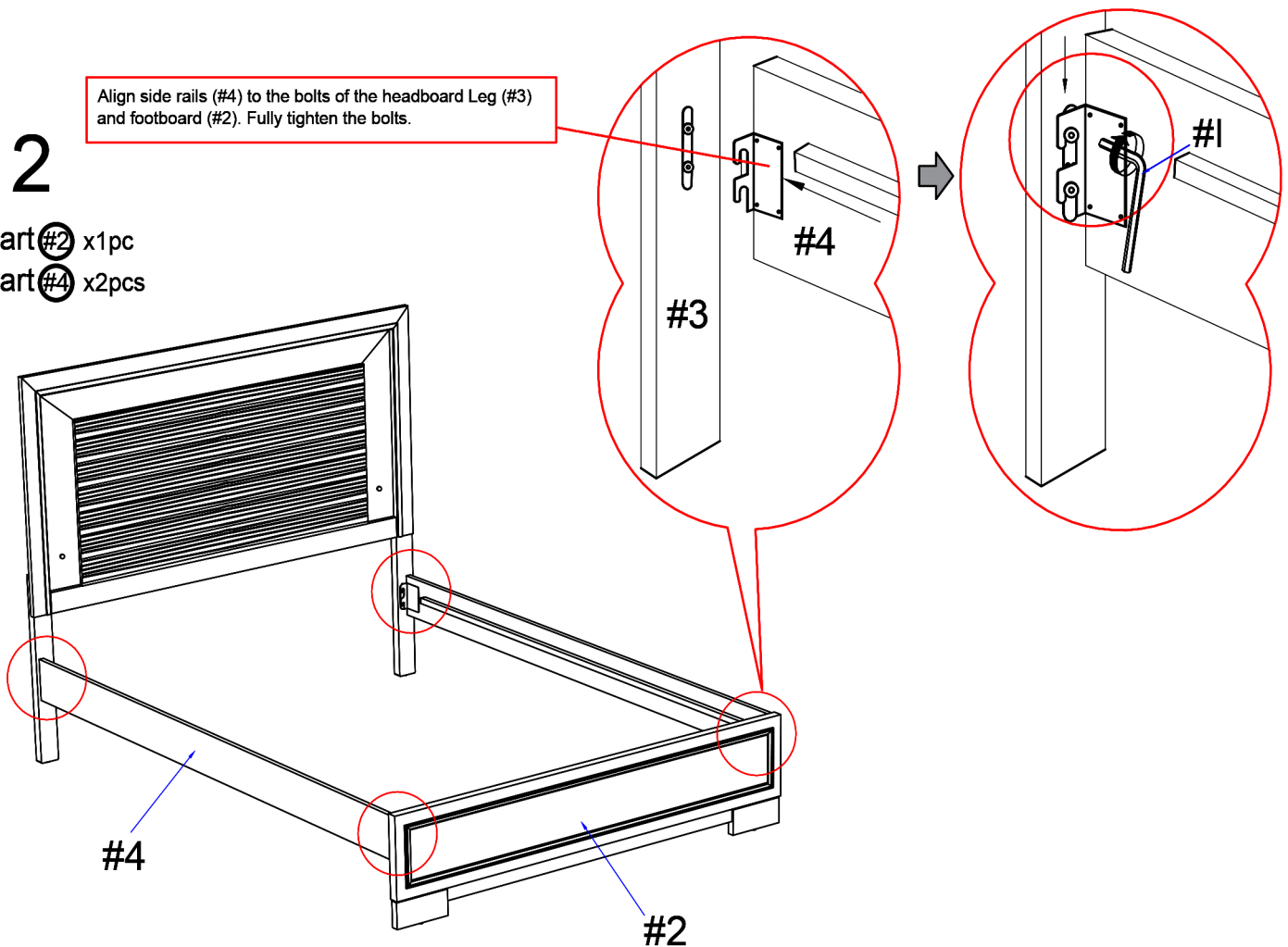

Align side rails (#4) to the bolts of the headboard Leg (#3) and footboard (#2). Fully tighten the bolts.



ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS

Secure the Bed slat support (#7) to the bed slat (#5) and support center slat (#6) by using Bolt (#G).

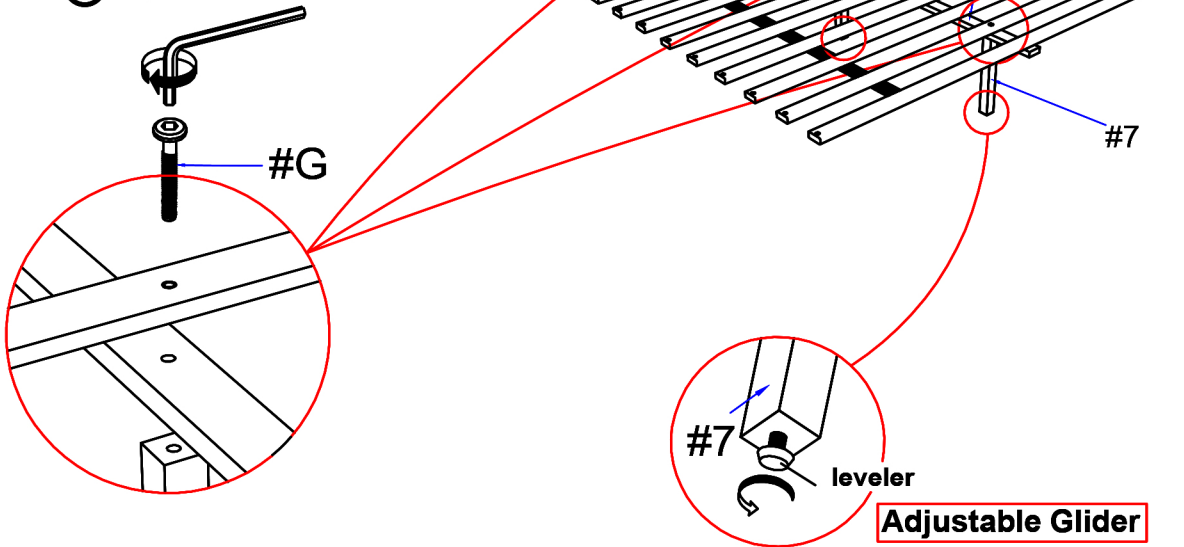

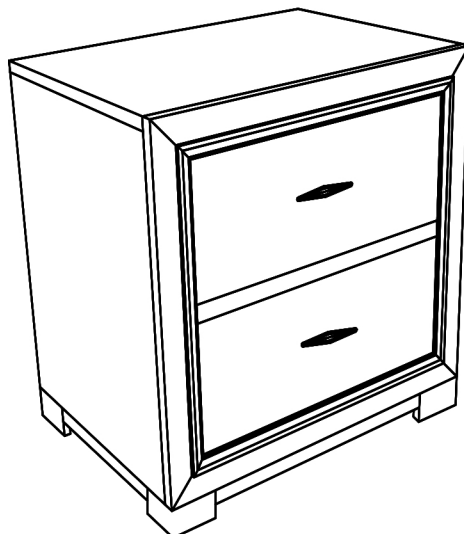
Unscrew the handle
from within the drawer



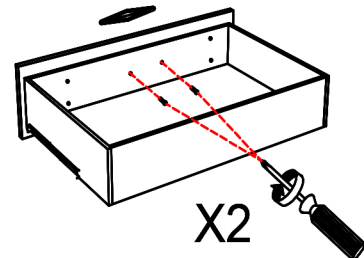

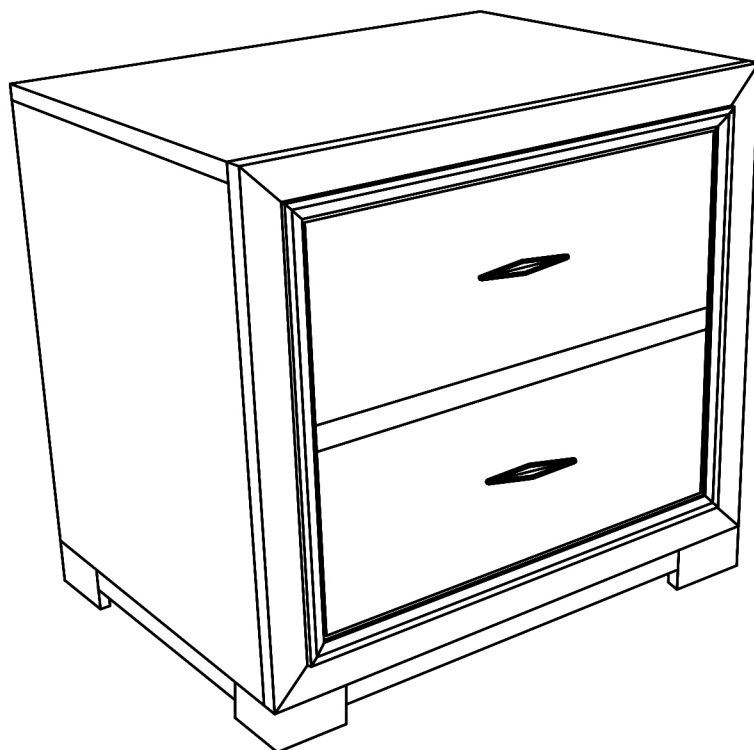


Tighten the screw back after
