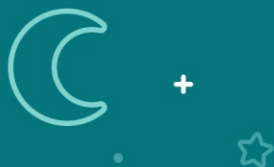

Do not assemble on flooring or carpet

















Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)














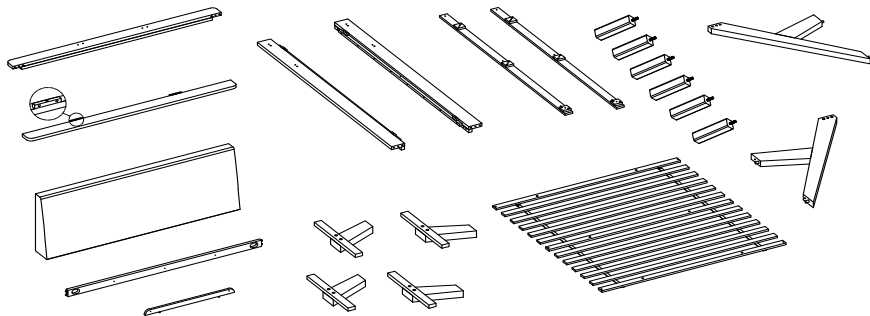


This Bed has multiple parts, and may require up to 45 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Bed parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarize yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Please follow the below steps carefully to ensure a proper assembly.

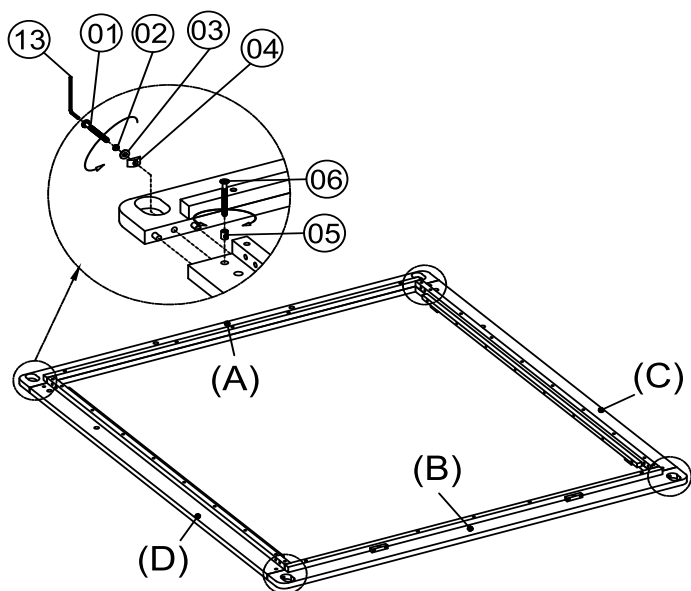
Step 1

- Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.



Step 2

- With assistance from your adult partners, carefully place the Headboard Bar (A), Footboard Bar (B), Left Side Rail (C), Right Slide Rail (D) facedown on a clean, non-marring surface as shown below.
- Insert the Bolt ((6)) into Cross nut ((5)), then insert the Cross nut ((5)) into the housing on Side Rail. Attach the Headboard Bar (A), Footboard Bar (B) to the Left Side Rail (C) and Right Side Rail (D) using Bolts ((1)), Spring Washer ((2)), Flat Washer ((3)), Crescent Nut ((4)), Cross nut ((5)) and Allen Wrench ((13)) as shown below.
- **Note: Affix Bolt ((6)) into Cross Nut ((5)) inside the Side Rail then remove Bolt ((6)) from the Cross Nut ((5)).**
- **Fully tighten the Bolts at this stage.**

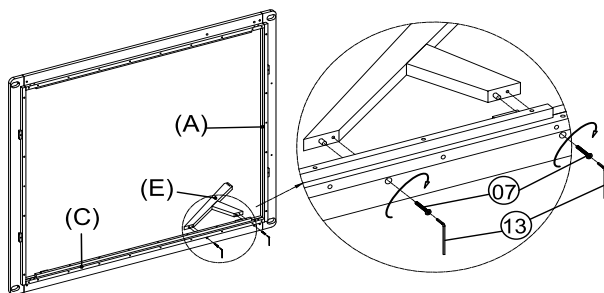


Step 3.1

- With assistance from your adult partners, turn the assembled part in step 2 right side up as shown below.

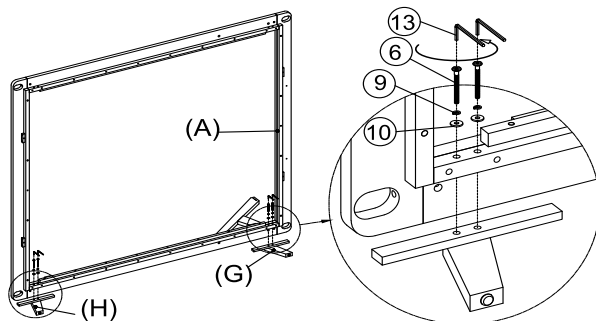
Attach the Left Support Bar (E) to the assembled part in Step 2 using Bolts (7) and the Allen Rench (13) as shown below.

- Fully tighten the Bolts at this stage.**



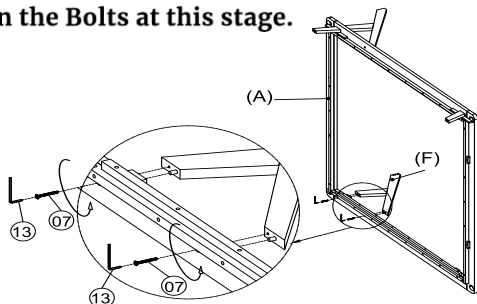
Step 3.2

- With your adult partners, Attach the First Leg (G) and Second Leg (H) to the assembled part in Step 3.1 using Bolts (6), Spring Washer (9), Flat Washer (10) and the Allen Wrench (13) as shown below.
- DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts.**



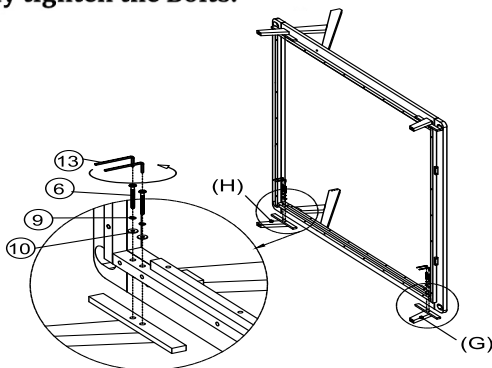
Step 4.1

- With assistance from your adult partners, lift the assembled part in Step 3 up, and rotate it 180 degrees as shown below.
Attach the Right Support Bar (F) to the assembled part in Step 3 using Bolts (7) and the Allen Wrench (13) as shown below.
- Fully tighten the Bolts at this stage.**



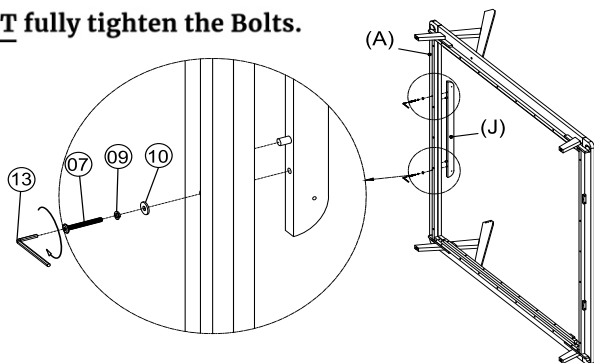
Step 4.2

- With your adult partners, attach the First Leg (G) and Second Leg (H) to the assembled part in Step 4.1 using Bolts (6), Spring Washer (9), Flat Washer (10) and the Allen Wrench (13) as shown below.
- DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts.**



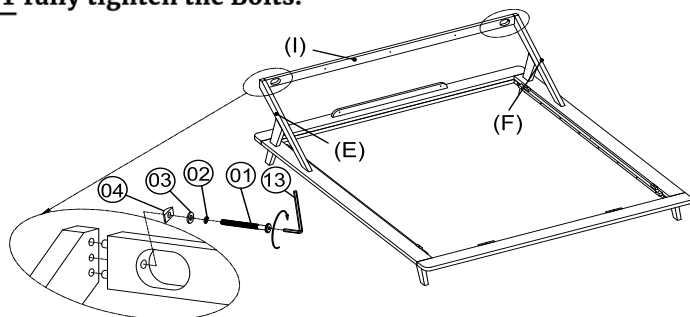
Step 5

- With the help of your adult partner, attach the Second Support Bar (J) to the Headboard Bar (A) using Bolts (7), Spring Washer (9), Flat Washer (10) and the Allen Wrench (13) as shown below.
- DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts.**



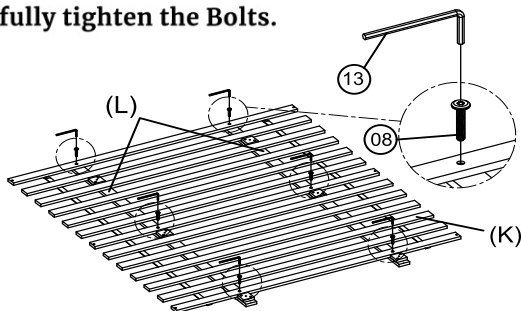
Step 6

- With the help of your adult partner, turn the assembled part in Step 5 to its right side up. Attach the First Support Bar (I) to the Left Support Bar (E) and Right Support Bar (F) using Bolts (1), Spring Washer (2), Flat Washer (3), Crescent Nut (4) and the Allen Wrench (13) as shown below.
- DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts.**



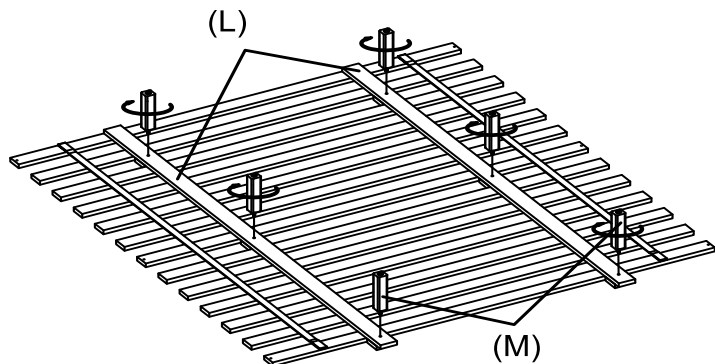
Step 7

- With the help of your adult partner, attach the Slat Frame (K) into the Third Support Bar (L) using Bolts (8) and the Allen Wrench (13) as shown below.
- DO NOT** fully tighten the Bolts.



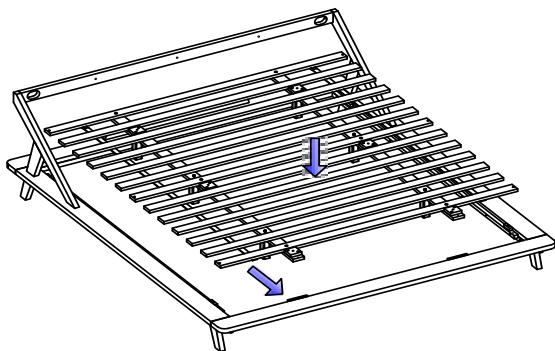
Step 8

- Turn the assembled parts in Step 7 face down.
- With the help of your adult partner, insert the Support Leg (M) into the assembled parts in Step 7 as shown below.
- DO NOT** fully tighten the Bolts.



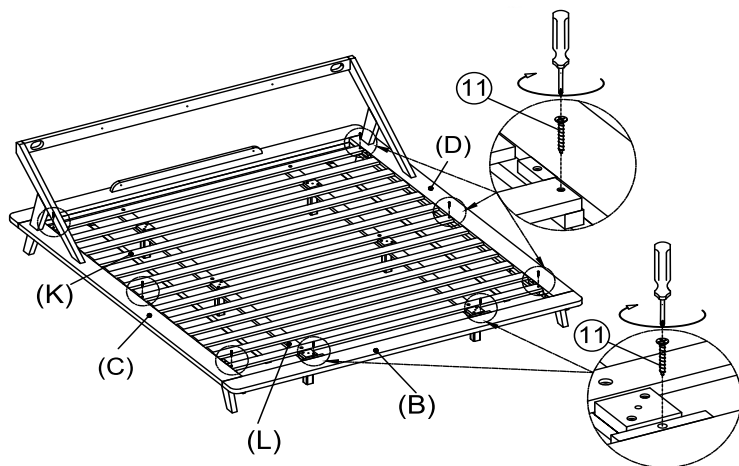
Step 9

- With the help of your adult partner, place the assembled parts in Step 8 into the assembled parts in Step 6.



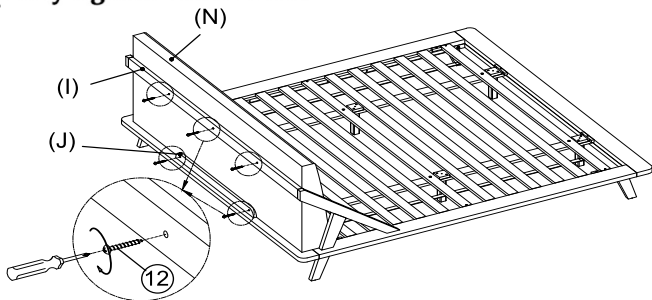
Step 10

- With the help of your adult partner, attach the Slat Frame (K) to the Left Side Rail (C). Ride Side Rail (D) and Footboard Bar (B) using Screws (11) and a Screwdriver (not provided) as shown below.
- DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts.**



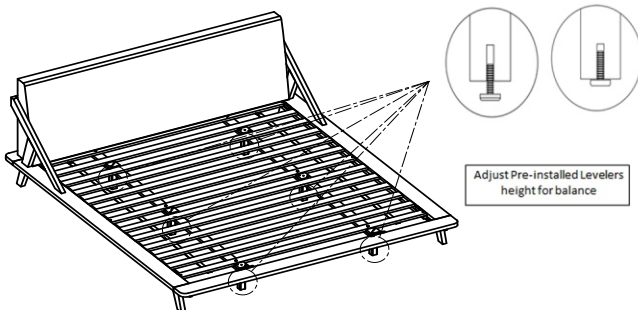
Step 11

- With help of your adult partner, attach the Headboard (N) to the First Support Bar (I), Second Support Bar (J) using Screws (12) and a Screwdriver (not provided) as shown below.
- **DO NOT** fully tighten the Screws.



Step 12

- Check for wobbles.
- In sequential manner, gradually tighten all Bolts until evenly secured.
- **Inspect the Bed and make sure all parts are adequately connected.**
- With assistance from your adult partner, adjust the levelers to the desired height to avoid wobbles.
- To adjust the Levelers, get assistance from an adult partner to lift/lean and hold the Bed while you are working.
- **Your Bed is ready for use. Bed can only be used on a flat, leveled surface.**



Care & Maintenance for your new Charleston Platform Bed



Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.



Not for commercial use. For residential use only.



Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.



Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.



Furniture may scratch floors. We recommend using furniture pads to protect your floors.



Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.



Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



Do not place furniture outside. For indoor use only.



Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.

The OkiOki Sleep Guide

A bedtime story





nce upon a time, there was a young boy with endless energy, who had trouble falling asleep at night.

Without many friends, he found himself often running alone in the wilderness, amongst the tranquil yet vibrant landscape. In this new and unfamiliar land, he soon discovered that New Zealand actually had more sheep than people. He would often walk miles without seeing anyone, but couldn't walk 100 feet without seeing sheep. He would run around the sheep, roll under them, jump over them and spend hours frolicking amongst the friendly creatures. It became his favorite pastime. The sheep seemed to enjoy his companionship just as much, as their human counterpart could pivot quickly and run fast, proving a worthy playmate in the rolling hills. One sheep, in particular, would always playfully chase the boy halfway home, eventually turning around to rejoin the herd. He called him Swifty.

When the young boy returned home after a day of play, he would tell his parents and grandparents about his adventures with great enthusiasm. The boy jumped off the walls with exuberance, acting out his favorite moments of the escapades. The zeal with which he re-lived these moments made it seem like he loved telling about the adventures as much as he loved living them.

As the rest of the household fell asleep, he would lay in bed, staring at the ceiling, his mind racing about what fun he'd have tomorrow. After weeks of restless nights, he realized that if he counted all of his sheep friends, who he identified by the hue and thickness of their respective fleeces, he could fall asleep more easily. This practice became his comforting method of dozing off each evening, counting the sheep, always starting with Swifty.

He would play all day and count sheep to sleep at night. One day, as the boy got ready to head home, Swifty was nowhere to be seen. The boy sprinted from the herd, and no sheep followed. This happened several days in a row, and Swifty's absence started to concern the boy.

He started to have trouble falling asleep. Weeks went by, then months. Maybe he wandered to another herd. Perhaps he fell off a cliff. Maybe Swifty found a better life elsewhere. Swifty was gone.

The boy would lay in bed at night, staring restlessly at the ceiling. She repeated this as he dozed off to sleep. OkiOki, the Maori word for rest, tranquility, and relaxation soothed the young boy. This ritual continued for years. And the OkiOki tradition continued beyond the young boy, with his children, and his children's children.

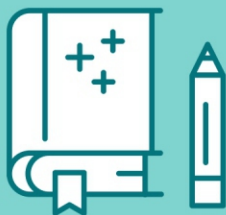


- Only 21% of Americans get the recommended 7 to 8 hours of sleep each night.


