
SAFETY WARNING

Never adjust chaise lounge or recliner backrest while seated.

Always make sure the backrest is flat before moving the chaise lounge.

Keep all limbs clear from under the backrest when it is in a raised posi on.

Care & Maintenance























- Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lintfree cloth.

CAUTION: This Chaise Lounge is NOT a TOY.


Keep your child / children at bay during the assembly process.

Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



Assembly Steps




This Chaise Lounge has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chaise Lounge parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions herebelow to familiarise the parts and steps before assembly.




Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Step 2




Place the Seat Panel (A) onto the clean, non-marring surface. With the assistance from your adult partner: **2.1** Attach the Right Front Leg (F) to the Seat Panel (A) by using Bolt (③) and Allen Wrench (④) as shown above **2.2** Attach the Right Back Leg (C) to the Seat Panel (A) by using Bolt (②) and Allen Wrench (④) as shown above **Do not fully tighten the Bolts.**



Lay down the assembed part in Step 2 on the ground as shown above.


With the assistance from your adult partner, attach the Back Cross Leg (D) to the Right Back Leg (C) and the Front Cross Leg (G) to Right Front Leg (F) of the assembled part in Step 2 by using Bolt (1), and Allen Wrench (4) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.



With the assistance from your adult partner:

4.1. Attach the Left Back Leg (B) to the Seat Panel (A) by using Bolt (②) and Allen Wrench (④) as shown above Attach the Left Back Leg (B) to the Back Cross Leg (D) by using Bolt (①) and Allen Wrench (④) as shown above **4.2.** Attach the Left Front Leg (E) to the Seat Panel (A) by using Bolt (③) and Allen Wrench (④) as shown above Attach the Left Front Leg (E) to the Front Cross Leg (G) by using Bolt (①) and Allen Wrench (④) as shown above **Do not fully tighten the Bolts.**



With assistance from your partner, stand the assembled part in Step 4 up.

Lift the headrest part of the Chaise Lounge to the desired position as shown above.

Place the Chaise Lounge on a LEVEL SURFACE.

Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Gently and gracefully, sit onto the Chaise Lounge.

This will help align all the parts at all joint areas.

Then get off the Chaise Lounge and proceed to tighten the Bolts and Screws in a sequential manner.

When tightening the Bolts and Screws, tighten sequentially.

DO NOT tighten any Bolts and Screws fully and then move on towards the next one.

If there are any wobbles after tightening, loosen the Bolts/Screws and execute this same process.

The Chaise Lounge is ready to be used.

This Chaise Lounge can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

· What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals. By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
