

# Assembly Instructions


CAUTION: You must read these Assembly Instructions before you proceed.

### **Care & Maintenance**










- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- ✓ ⑤ Keep away from sources of ignition.
- ✓ Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

Whenever moving/lifting the Chair and to prevent damage to the Chair, two adults are needed to execute these actions.




## Assembly Preparation

#### Before Beginning Assembly:




- Read instructions, cover to cover.


## Assembly Steps



This Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 50 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chair parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.



Place the Right Leg Panel (C), Seat Panel (D), Front Rail (E) facedown on a clean, non-marring surface.


Attach Back Rest (A) to the Right Leg Panel (C) using Bolts (1), (2), Sleeve Nut (3), Cross Nut (4) and the Allen Wrench (6) as shown above.

Attach Seat Panel (D) to the Right Leg Panel (C) using Bolts (1), (2), Cross Nut (4), and the Allen Wrench (6) as shown above.

Attach Front Rail (E) to the Right Leg Panel (C).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts.


Caution: Please don't place your hands between the gaps to avoid injury.



Attach Seat Panel (D) to the Right Leg Panel (C) using Bolts (2) and the Allen Wrench (6) as shown above.

Attach Front Rail (E) to the Right Leg Panel (C) using Screws (5) and a Screwdriver (not provided) (7) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts and the Screws.




Attach Back Rest (A) to the Left Leg Panel (B) using Bolts (1), (2), Sleeve Nut (3), Cross Nut (4) and the Allen Wrench (6) as shown above.

Attach Seat Panel (D) to the Right Leg Panel (C) using Bolts (1), (2), Cross Nut (4), and the Allen Wrench (6) as shown above.

Attach Front Rail (E) to the Right Leg Panel (C).


Do not fully tighten the Bolts.



Attach Seat Panel (D) to the Left Leg Panel (B), Back Rest (A) using Bolts (2) and the Allen Wrench(6) as shown above.

Attach Front Rail (E) to the Left Leg Panel (B) using Screws (5) and a Screwdriver (not provided) (7) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts and the Screws.



Place the Chair onto a flat, level surface.

Then EXERT pressure floorward onto the Chair with both hands.


This pressure will help the Chair reach full alignment at all joints.

In a sequential manner, gradually tighten all Bolts and screws at all joints until evenly secured.

Inspect the Chair and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Adjust the Levelers until the Chair is level with the ground.

To adjust the Levelers, get assistance from an adult partner to lean and hold the Chair while you are working.



Place the Seat Cushion (F) onto the Seat Panel (D).

With the help of your adult partner, turn the chair over and Tie the magic tape straps on the Seat Cushion (F) to the Seat Panel (D) as shown above

Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Ensure all screws, bolts are fully locked into position and secured.

Then again with the help of your adult partner, turn the Chair right side up.

The Chair is ready to be used.

Caution: This Chair can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm.

These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
