Care & Maintenance



- Not for commercial use. For residential use only.



- Furniture may scratch floors. We recommend using furniture pads to protect your floors.



- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



- Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.



- Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.



- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



- Do not place furniture outside . For indoor use only.



- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.



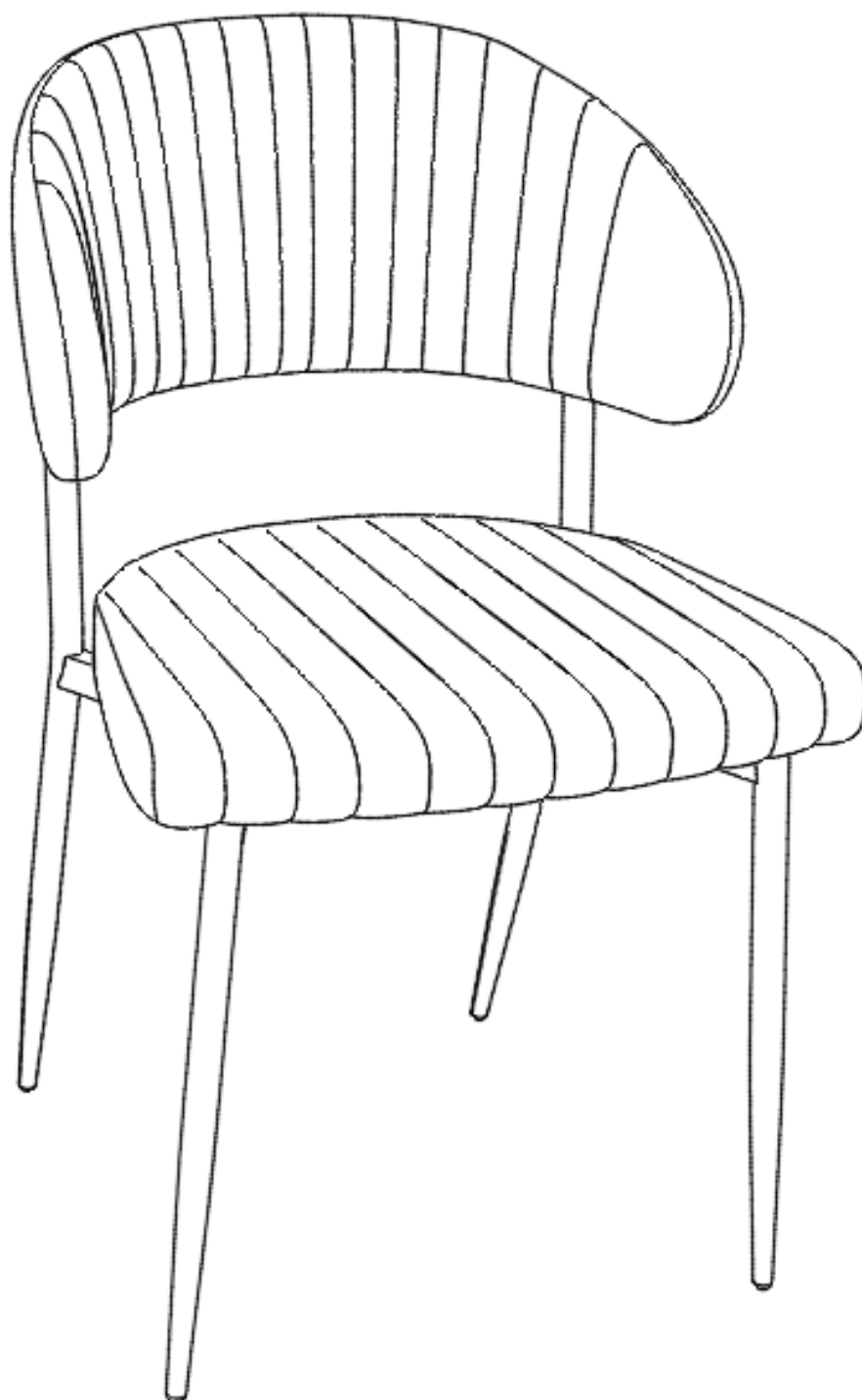
- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.






- Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

- Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-



- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



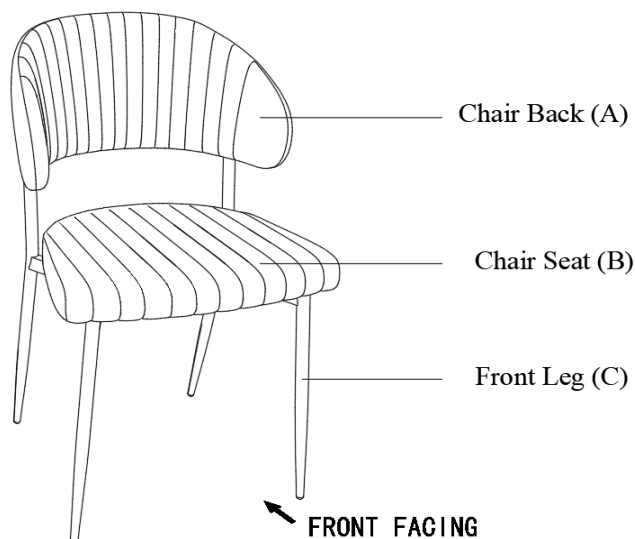
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

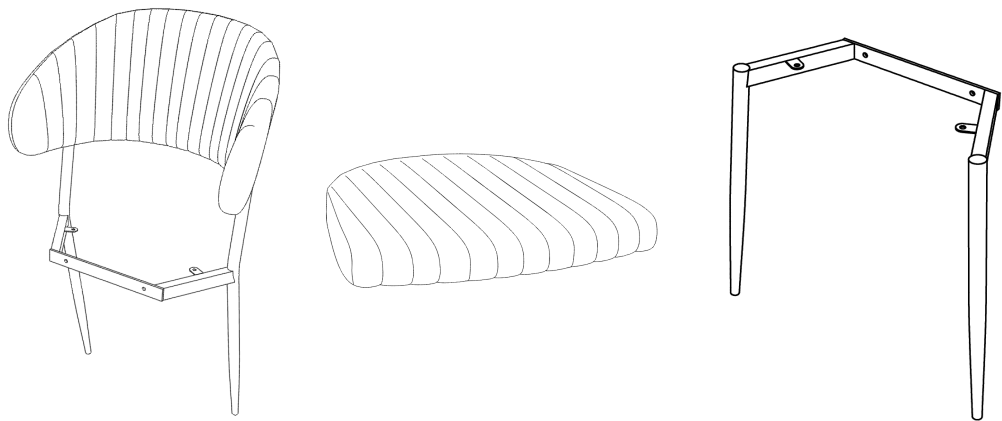
Assembly Steps

Overview



This Chair has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chair parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



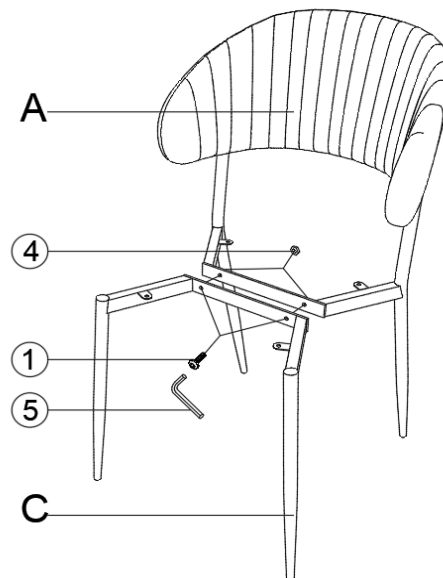

Place the Chair Back(A), the Chair Seat(B), the Front Leg(C), onto a clean, non-marring surface.

Step 2

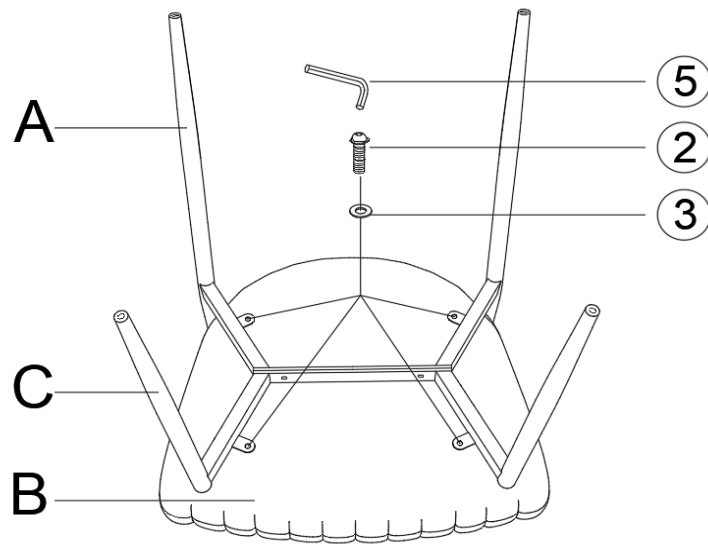


Place the backrest(A) and the front legs (C) as shown in the figure, align the middle two holes.

Insert the screw ① through the central hole and secure the other end with a nut ④.

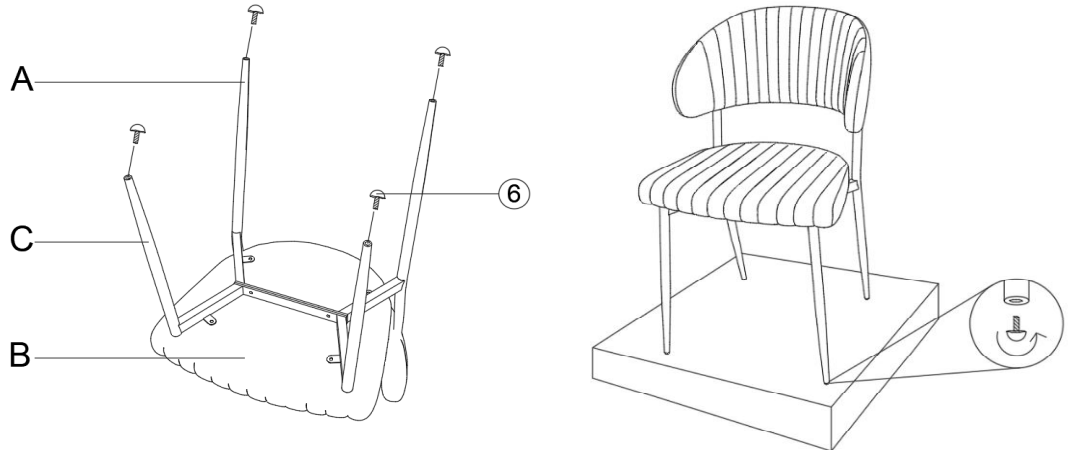
In this step, make sure to align (A) and (C), and tighten the screws.

Step 3



Turn the cushion (B) over, bottom side up, then invert the assembly from the previous step (A) (C) onto the cushion (B). (shown in the figure). Insert screw ② through washer ③ and attach the rack to the seat cushion (B) through the holes in the rack (as in the figure). If the screw turns with resistance, tap the frame to align the hole with the screw, then tighten it.

Step 4



Screw the adjustable foot ⑥ into the hole at the bottom of the chair leg. (As shown in the figure)

Place the Chair on a **LEVEL SURFACE**. Rotate and adjust the bottom feet (6) so that the chair legs are no longer obbly or uneven. Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected. Gently and carefully tap the seat and check for wobbleness, then tighten all bolts in a asequential manner. If there is still wobbling, loosen the bolts and repeat the same process.

Your Chair is ready for use.

This Chairl can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals. Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
