Step 1




Install the Wooden Tenons(1) into the sides of the Top Panel (A) as picture above.

Step 2




Attach the right side boad(B), left side board(D) and middle clapboad (C) to the top panel(A), use long bolt(②) and flat washer(③) align with board hole position, Allen wrench (④) is used to assist rotation tightening. ATTENTION: All the grooves must be stay in one side(backside). The short distance from the edge to the hole is upside for middle clapboard(C).

Step 3




Insert the back board of the top(E), slot(F) and the back board of the bottom (G) to the grooves.

Step 4




Install the bottom panel(H) as the above picture, then pull the iron foot out from the bottom panel(H) to vertical postion.


Step 5




First, use long bolt(②) and flat washer(③) align with board hole position to fix the bottom panel(H); Second, connect the iron foot with bar iron on the corner of the bottom panel (H) by short bolt (⑤); Third, rotate and tighten the middle foot(I); Lastly install the door stopper(⑦) with screw(⑧) on the top panel(A).



Stand the mounted sideboard up, and insert shelf support pin(6) into each panel hole.




Put the Shelf Board(J) on the shelf support pin(6).




Install the connecting curved door hinge(10) on the hole side of the left door(K) and right door (N), and the straight door hinge(11) on the hole side of the middle door 1(L) and middle door 2(M) with screw(9). Install the sheet iron(12) on the back of doors' predrilled hole position with screw(8).






As shown on the order of picture, use the screw(9) to connect the curved door hinge(10) and the straight door hinge(11) to the sideboard body.



Align with the pre-drilled hole on the back board of the top(E), screw the expansion screw (4) in to the wall. Install the short side of Anti-Tipping sheet iron(13) on the wall with screw(15), then using the long side of Anti-tipping sheet iron (13) connected to the inside of the right side boad(B)and left side board(D) by srew(16)



The sideboard is ready for use.

This cabinet can only be used on flat and level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals. Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water. Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?
 The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.
- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals. By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
