Care & Maintenance



- Not for commercial use. For residential use only.



- Furniture may scratch floors. We recommend using furniture pads to protect your floors.



- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



- Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.



- Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.



- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



- Do not place furniture outside. For indoor use only.



- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.



- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.







- Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.





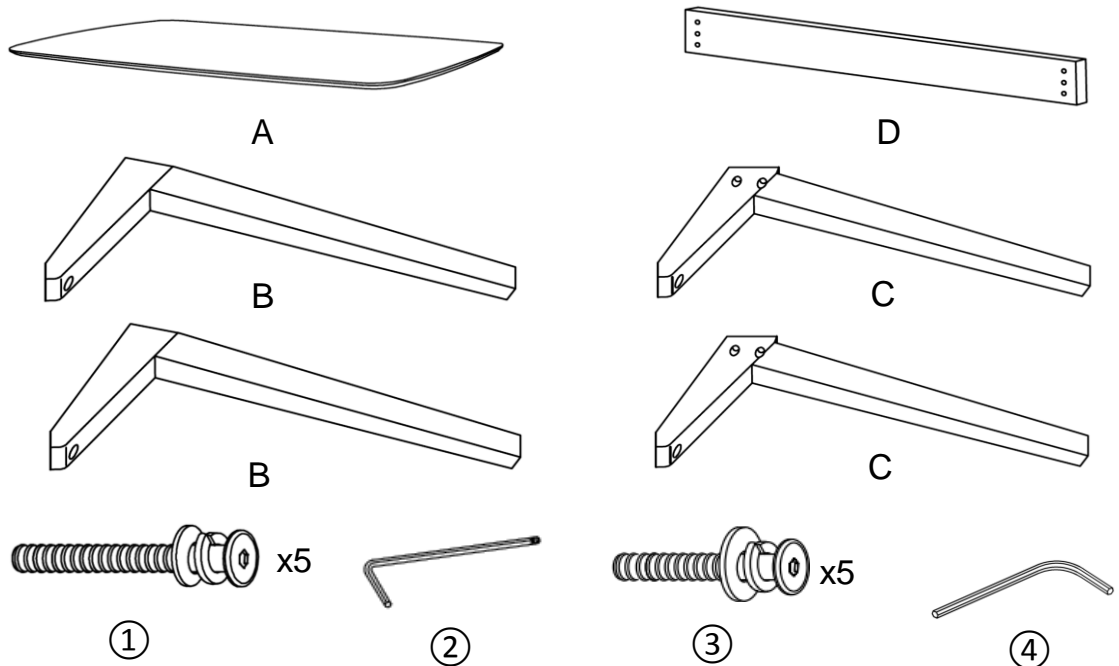

- Read instructions, cover to cover-



- Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-



- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



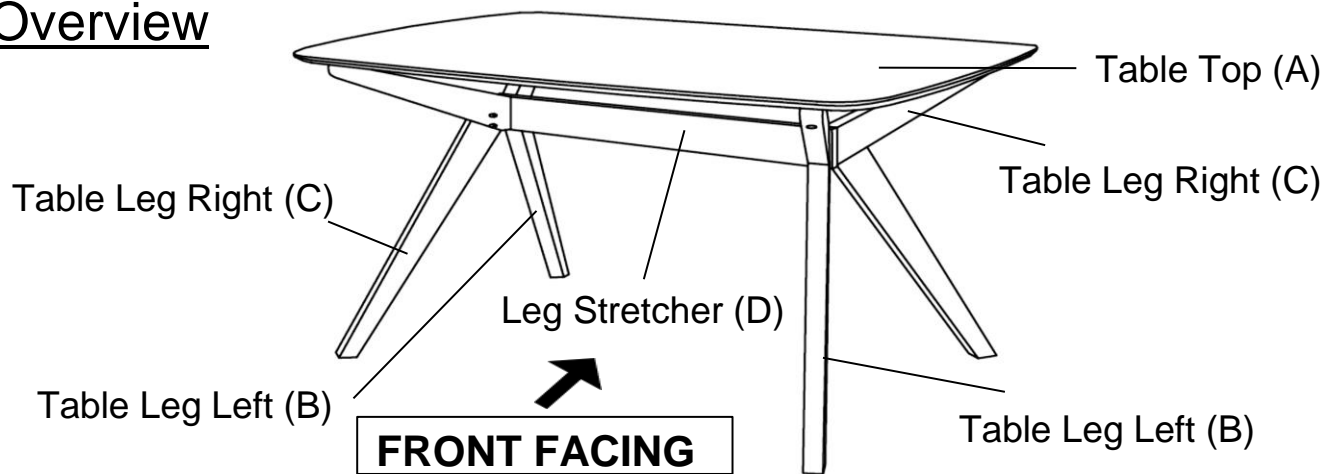
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

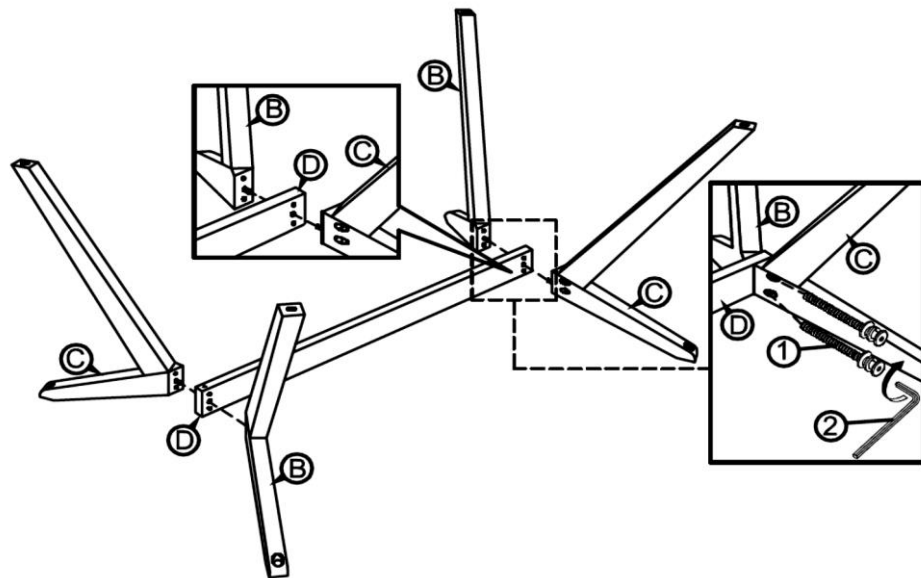
Assembly Steps

Overview



This Dining Table has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Dining Table parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



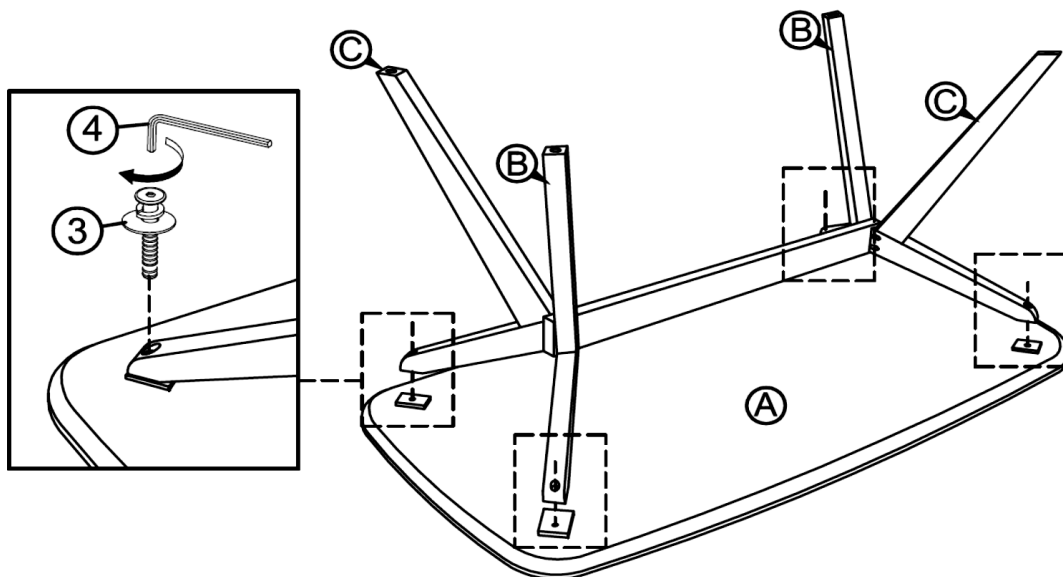
Two adults are required during lifting and assembling.

Insert the pre-installed dowel on the Table Leg Left (B) and Table Leg Right (C) into the holes on Leg Stretcher (D) as shown.

Fix the Table Leg (C) to Table Leg (B) with JCBC ① + Spring Washer + Flat Washer using Allen Wrench M4 ②.

At this stage, only loosely tighten the bolts.

Step 2

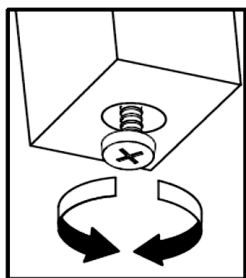


Place the Table Top (A) face down onto a clean, soft surface to avoid any scratches or damages to the product.

Position Table Leg assembly from Step 1 and align the hole at the Table Top (A). Fix the Table Leg (B & C) with JCBB Bolt (3) + Spring Washer + Flat Washer using Allen Wrench M5 (4).

At this stage, only loosely tighten the bolts.

Step 3



With assistance from your adult partner, stand the table up.

Turn clockwise or anti-clockwise to adjust leg leveller.

The **Max** height during 0.25~0.8inch.

Step 4



If the table wobbles, loosen and tighten the screws and bolts, and use your hand to press down on the top of the table, to ensure evenness, and then fully tighten the bolts sequentially.

FULLY TIGHTEN ALL THE BOLTS.

The Dining Table is now ready for use.

Caution: This Dining Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
