

Care & Maintenace






- O Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- O Do not place furniture under direct sunlight
- Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.
- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the suface.

- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.



Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-




Save all packaging until finished-


Assembly Steps




This Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 20 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chair, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.




Attach Left leg (A) to Seat panel (C). Use Allen wrench (4) with Bolts (2). DO NOT: Fully tighten the bolts.




From step 2, using the allen Wrench (4), attach Back Panel (D) into assembly as shown above by using Bolts (1).

DO NOT: Fully tighten the Bolts.




From step 3, using the Allen wrench (4), attach Right leg (B) into assembly as shown above by using Screw (3).

DO NOT: Fully tighten the Bolts and Screw.



From step 4, using the Allen wrench (4), attach Bolts (2), Bolt (1), Screw (3) intoassembly as shown above.

DO NOT: Fully tighten the Bolts and Screw.




Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Carefully sit in the Chair. This pressure will help align all parts at all joints. Then get off the Chair and proceed to tighten the Bolts and Screws in a sequential manner.

When tightening the Bolts and Screws tighten sequentially. DO NOT tighten any Bolt or Screw fully and then move on towards the next one.

If there are any wobbles after tightening, loosen the Bolts and Screws and execute this same process.



Place the Seat Cushion (E) and Back Cushions (F) on the Chair as shown above.

Your Chair is ready to be used.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals. Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list? The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.
- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
