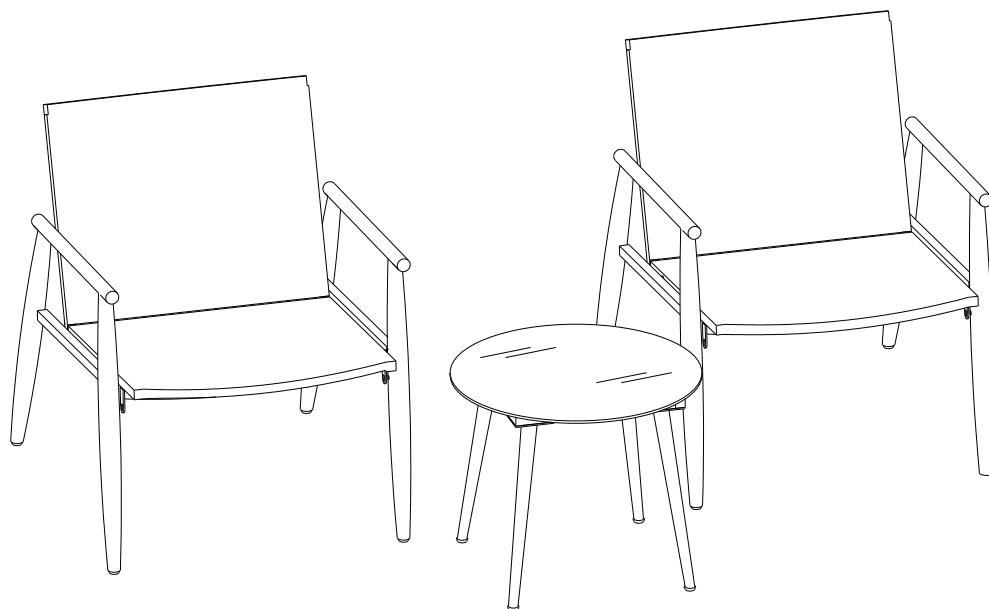
CAUTION : You must read these Assembly Instructions before you proceed.

Care & Maintenance

- ⊘  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
- ⊘  ● Prolonged exposure to rain may cause rusting which can stain floors.
- ⊘  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- ⊘  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- ✓  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
- ⊘  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
- ⊘  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- ✓  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
- ⊘  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- ✓  ● Keep away from sources of ignition.
- ✓  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.





- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



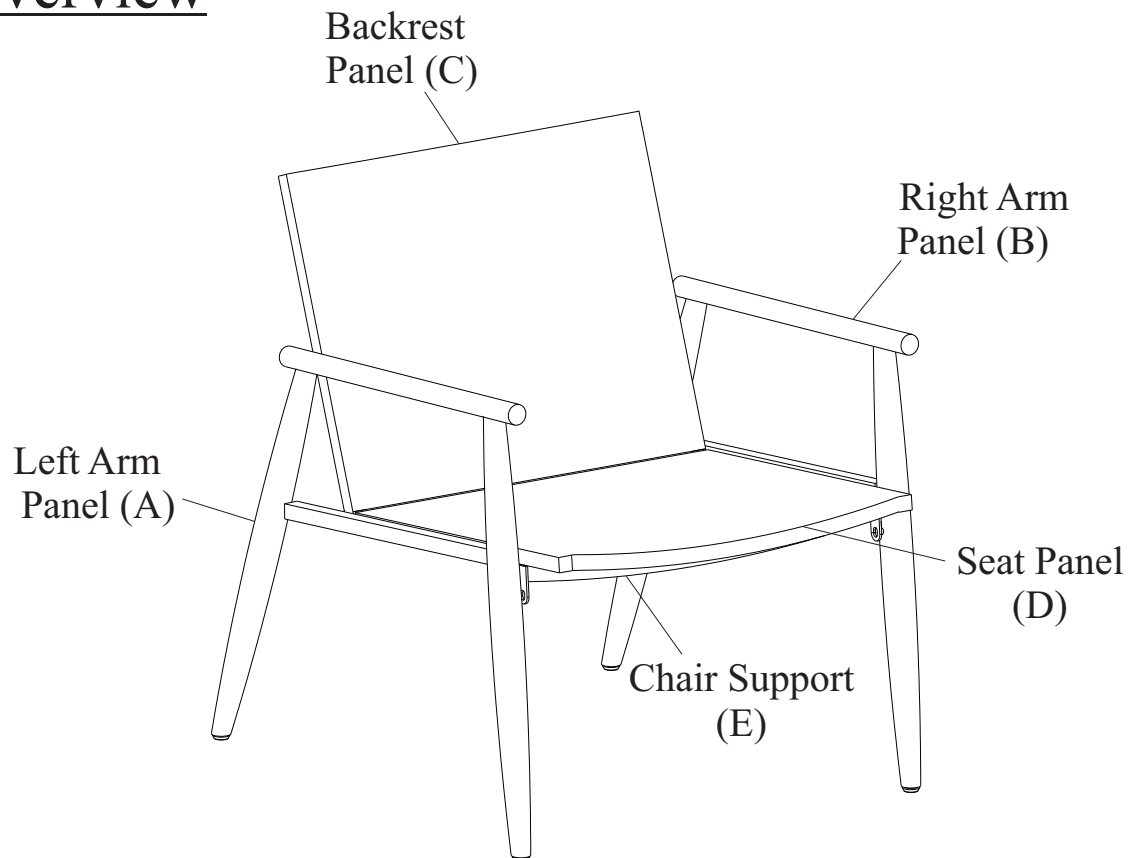
- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



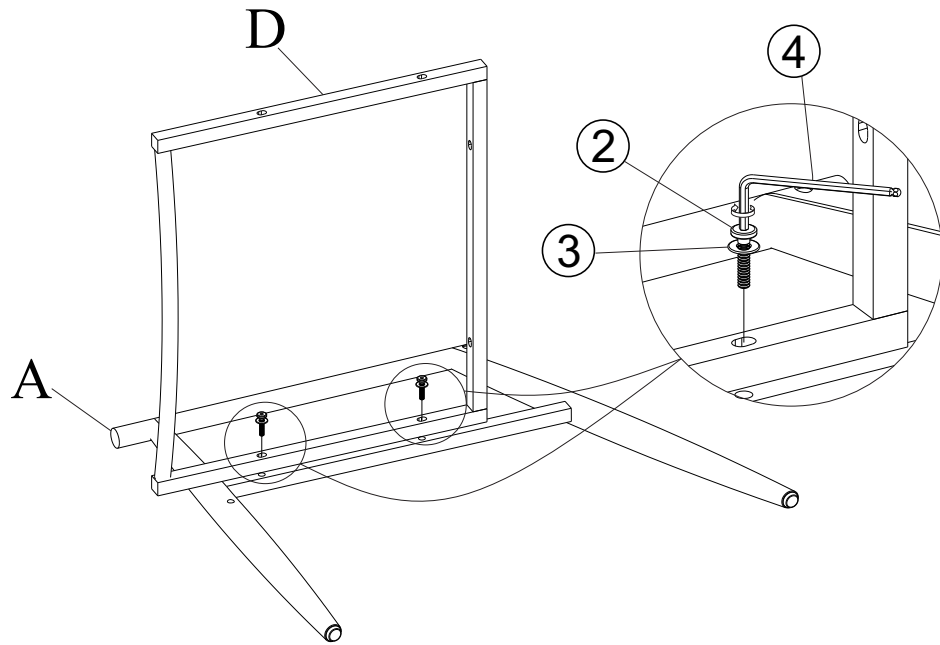

Assembly Steps.

Overview



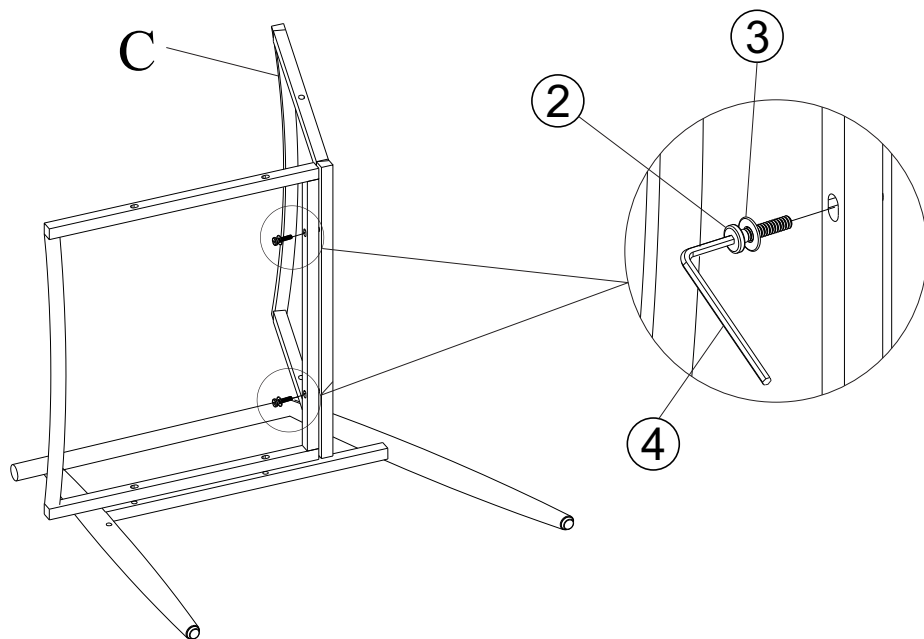
STEP 1



First, Connect Left Arm Panel (A) and Seat Panel (D), Using Bolts (2), Washer (3) and Allen Wrench (4).

DO NOT FULLY TIGHTEN BOLTS.

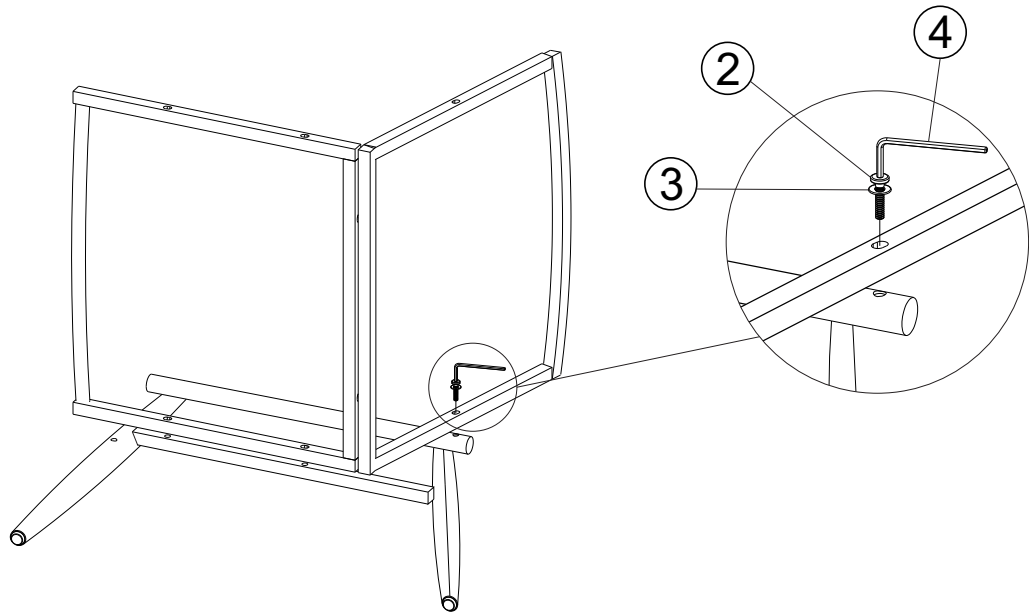
STEP 2



Then, Connect Backrest Panel (C) with step 1, Using Bolts (2), Washer (3) and Allen Wrench (4).

DO NOT FULLY TIGHTEN BOLTS.

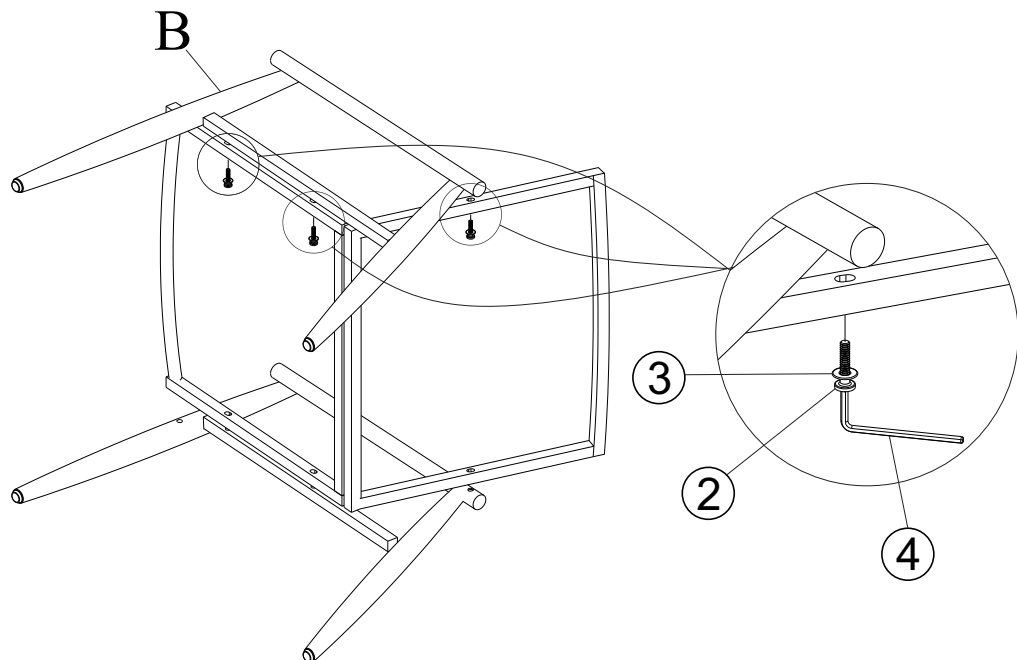
STEP 3



Next, Be hind, connect Left Arm Panel (A) and Backrest Panel (C) , Using Bolts (2), Washer (3) and Allen wrench (4).

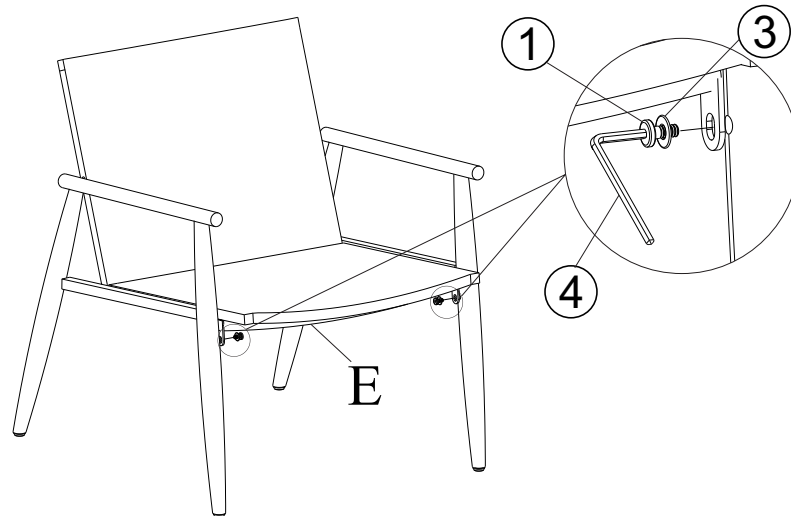
DO NOT FULLY TIGHTEN BOLT.

STEP 4



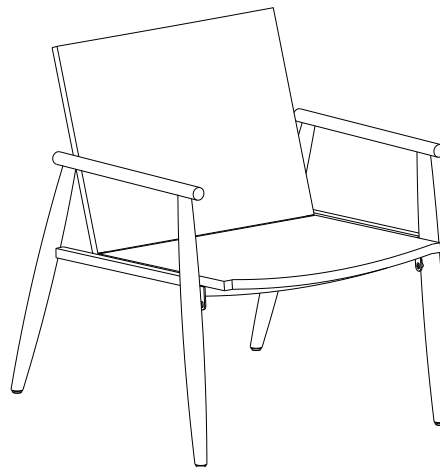
Next, Connect Right Arm Panel (B) with step 3, Using Bolts (2), Washer (3) and Allen wrench (4).

DO NOT FULLY TIGHTEN BOLTS.

STEP 5

Then, Connect step 4 with Chair Support (E), Using Bolts (1), Washer (3) and Allen wrench (4).

DO NOT FULLY TIGHTEN BOLTS.

STEP 6**X2**

Turn the Chairs right side up.

Place the Chairs on a LEVEL SURFACE.

Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Gently and gracefully, sit into the Chairs.

This would help to align all the parts at all the joint areas.

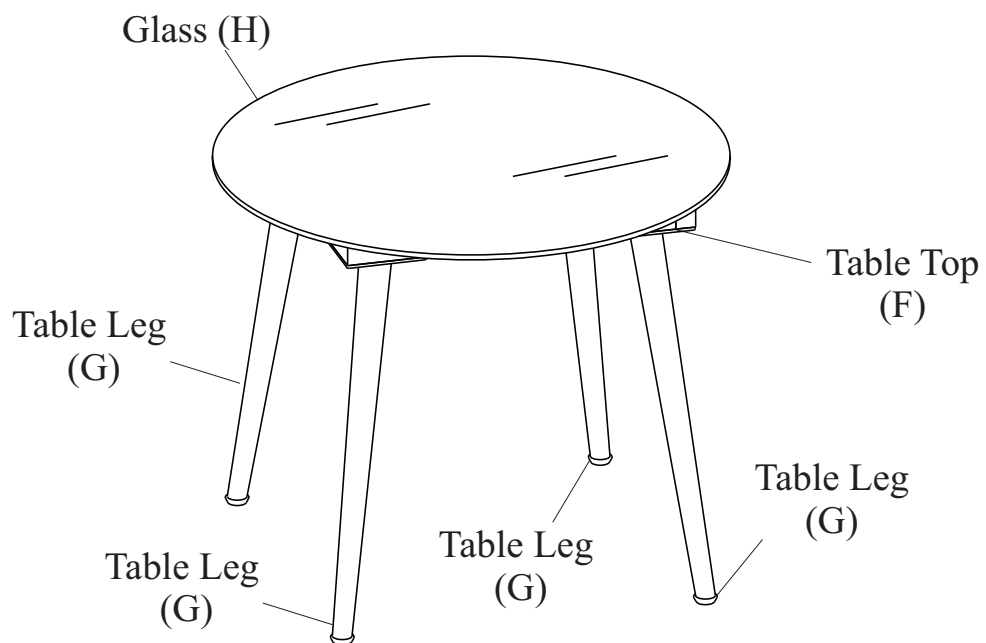
Then get off the Chairs, and in a sequential manner, proceed to tighten all Bolt.

To tighten the Bolt at the base of the Backrest, do secure assistance from your adult partner(s).

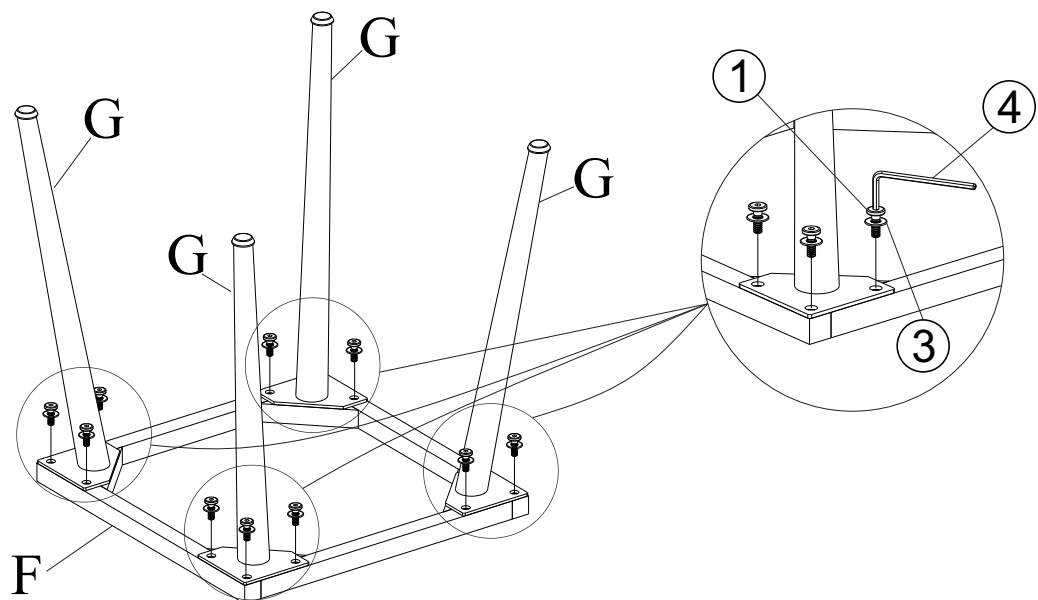
You may be required to turn the Bolt, to gain easy access to the secure points.

Turn the Chairs in a synchronised manner.

Overview



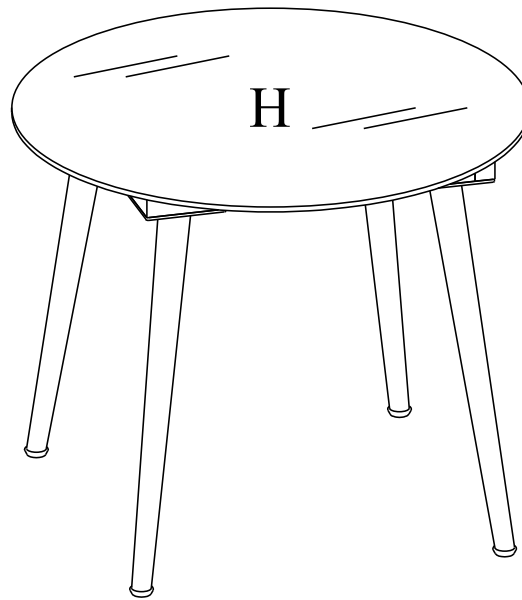
STEP 1



First, Connect top table (F) and table leg (G), Using Bolts (1), Washer (3) and Allen wrench .

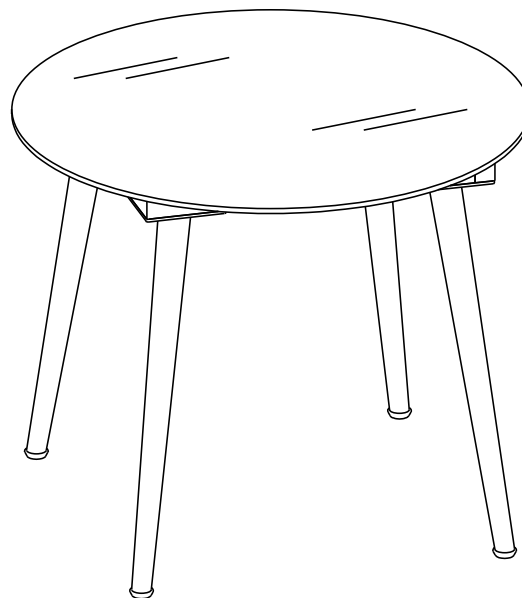
TIGHTEN THE BOLTS.

STEP 2



Then put on the glass on the table to finish.

STEP 3



Place the Table onto a flat, level surface.
Then EXERT pressure, floorwards onto the Table with both hands.
This pressure will help to align all the parts at all joint areas.
In a sequential manner, gradually tighten all Bolts at all joints until evenly secured.
Inspect the Table and make sure all parts are adequately connected.
Your Table is ready for use.
This Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.

CAUTION 1: When tightening these screws, tighten sequentially. DO NOT tighten any Bolt fully and then towards the next one. This would cause the frame to warp.

If there is still wobbles, loosen the Bolt and execute this same process.

WARNING!! IF THE CHAIR OR TABLE IS NOT STABLE , IT COULD LEAD TO DAMAGING THE PRODUCT.

Ensure all bolt are fully locked into position.

The chat set is ready to be used.

Caution 2: This chat set can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
