Caution: You must read these Assembly Instructions before you proceed.




Never adjust chaise lounge or recliner backrest while seated.

Always make sure the backrest is flat before moving the chaise lounge.

Keep all limbs clear from under the backrest when it is in a raised position.

Serious finger, hand, or other bodily injuries may result from adjusting the chaise lounge backrest position while seated.



**CAUTION:** This Chaise Lounge is NOT a TOY.


Keep your child / children at bay during the assembly process.

# Assembly Preparation

#### Before Beginning Assembly:

• Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




• Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-




• Save all packaging until finished-

## Assembly Steps




This Chaise Lounge has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chaise Lounge parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise youself with the parts and steps before assembly.



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.


#### Step 2



Place the Seat Panel (A) onto the clean, non-marring surface

With the assistance from your adult partner, attach the Leg Panel (B) to the Seat Panel (A) by using Bolt (1) and Allen Wrench (2) as shown above

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time



Place the Cushion (C) onto the Chaise Lounge and stick the magic tape as shown above.

Place the Chaise Lounge on a LEVEL SURFACE.

Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Gently and gracefully, sit onto the Chaise Lounge


This will help align all the parts at all joint areas.

Then get off the Chaise Lounge and proceed to tighten the Bolts in a sequential manner.

**CAUTION**: When tightening these screws and bolts, tighten sequentially.

**DO NOT** tighten any screw or bolt fully and then move towards the next one. This could cause the frame to warp.

WARNING!! IF THE CHAISE LOUNGE IS NOT STABLE, IT COULD LEAD TO DAMAGING THE PRODUCT.



With assistance from your partner, stand the assembled part in Step 3 up.

Lift the headrest part of the Chaise Lounge to the desired position as shown above.

The Chaise Lounge is ready to be used.

This Chaise Lounge can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
