Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



 To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.



Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.




• Keep away from sources of ignition.



Assembly Preparation

Before Beginning Assembly:

· Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-




Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-

Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



Save all packaging until finished-


Assembly Steps




This Coffee Table has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble.

To give you an overview of the Coffee Table parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective.

Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.




Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.



With the help of your adult partner, attach Leg Panel 2 (C) to Leg Panel 1 (B) with Bolt (3) and Washer (4) using Allen Wrench (5) as shown above.

Repeat the same process with the remaining Leg Panel 1 (B) and Leg Panel 2 (C).

DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts.




With the help of your adult partner, place Table Top (A) facing down.

Place the assembled Leg frames (B&C) in Step 2 to the Table Top (A) as shown above.


Then, attach assembled Leg frames (B&C) to Table Top (A) with Bolt (1) and Washer (4) using Allen Wrench (5).

DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts.



Attach assembled Leg frames (B&C) to Table Top (A) with Bolt (②) and Washer (④) using Allen Wrench (⑤).

DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts.



Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Turn the Coffee Table right side up.

Gently and gracefully use hand press down on the Coffee Table.

This will help to align all the parts at all joint areas.

Then get take out hand off the Coffee Table and in a sequential manner, gradually tighten all Bolts at all joints until evenly connected.

If there are still wobbles, loosen the Bolts and execute this same process.

Adjust Pre-installed Leveler height for balance as shown above.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
