Keep away from sources of ignition.




• Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

Keep your child / children at bay during the assembly process.







This Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overvew of the Chair parts, we've provided the above picture to put the various parts in perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

FRONT FACING




Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.



Please carefully place the panels on a clean, scratch-free surface as shown in the above picture.


Attach Left frame (A), Right frame (B) with Leg support bar (E,F,D) by using Screw (1), Bolt (3) and Allen wrench (5).

Do not: Fully tighten the Screws and Bolts.




Attach Seat frame (C) into assembled frame from step 2 by using Bolts (2) as shown in the above picture.

Gradully tighten all Bolts and Screws until evenly secured.



Use the Bolt (3) to tighten Seat frame (C) into Left frame (A) and Right frame (B). Gradully tighten all Bolts and Screws until evenly secured.



Place the Seat and Back cushion (G) on the Chair as shown above. Turn the product upright and adjust the levelers at the bottom of the legs (if needed) to balance the Chair.

Your Chair is ready to be used.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals. Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list? The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.
- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
