Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.



 Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



 To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.



• Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.



 Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lintfree cloth.

Please look in boxes for hardware packs and legs. Sets often ship in multiple boxes and may arrive a day or two apart.




Whenever lifting or moving the Table and to prevent damage to the chair, two adults may be needed to execute these actions.

Do not assemble on flooring or carpet.




Assemble on a clean non-marring suface (packing foam).




Save all packaging until finished.

Assembly Preparation

Overview



This Table has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Table, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions here below to familiarise the parts and steps before assembly.




Open the box and place all parts on a clean, non-damaging surface.

- 1.1) Align the Leg Table (O) with the Table Top (N), matching the holes as shown in the illustration.
- 1.2) Attach the four Legs Table (O) to the Table Top (N) using Bolt (3), Washers (4), and the Allen Wrench (5) as shown in the illustration.

Tighten the Bolt 100%.

Step 2



2.1) Then, with the assistance from an adult partner, stand the Table upright.

Adjust the Pre-installed Levellers until the Table is level with the ground.

To adjust the Levellers, with assistance from an adult partner, tilt the Table to rest on two legs.

Adjust the levellers to the desired height until the Table is level.

Step 3



3.1) Your table is now ready for use. Your table can only be used on a flat surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

 The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and second s
- The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.
- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
