I. Align the Left/Right Foot (2,3) to Stretcher (4) and secure by using Bolt (A) with Spring washer (B) and Flat washer (C). II. Attach the Left/Right Foot (2,3) to the Headboard (1) by using Bolt (A) with Spring washer (B) and Flat washer (C).

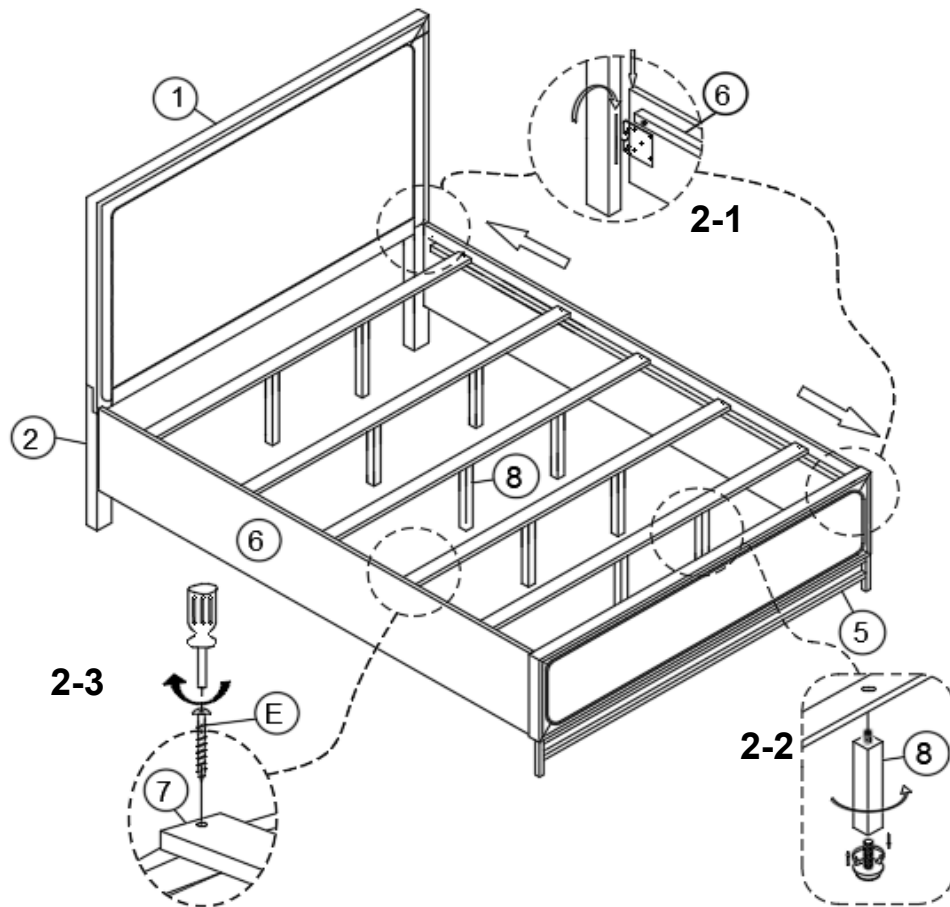

I. Hook the Side Rails (6) onto the Headboard (1) and the Footboard (5). Ensure rails are locked in.

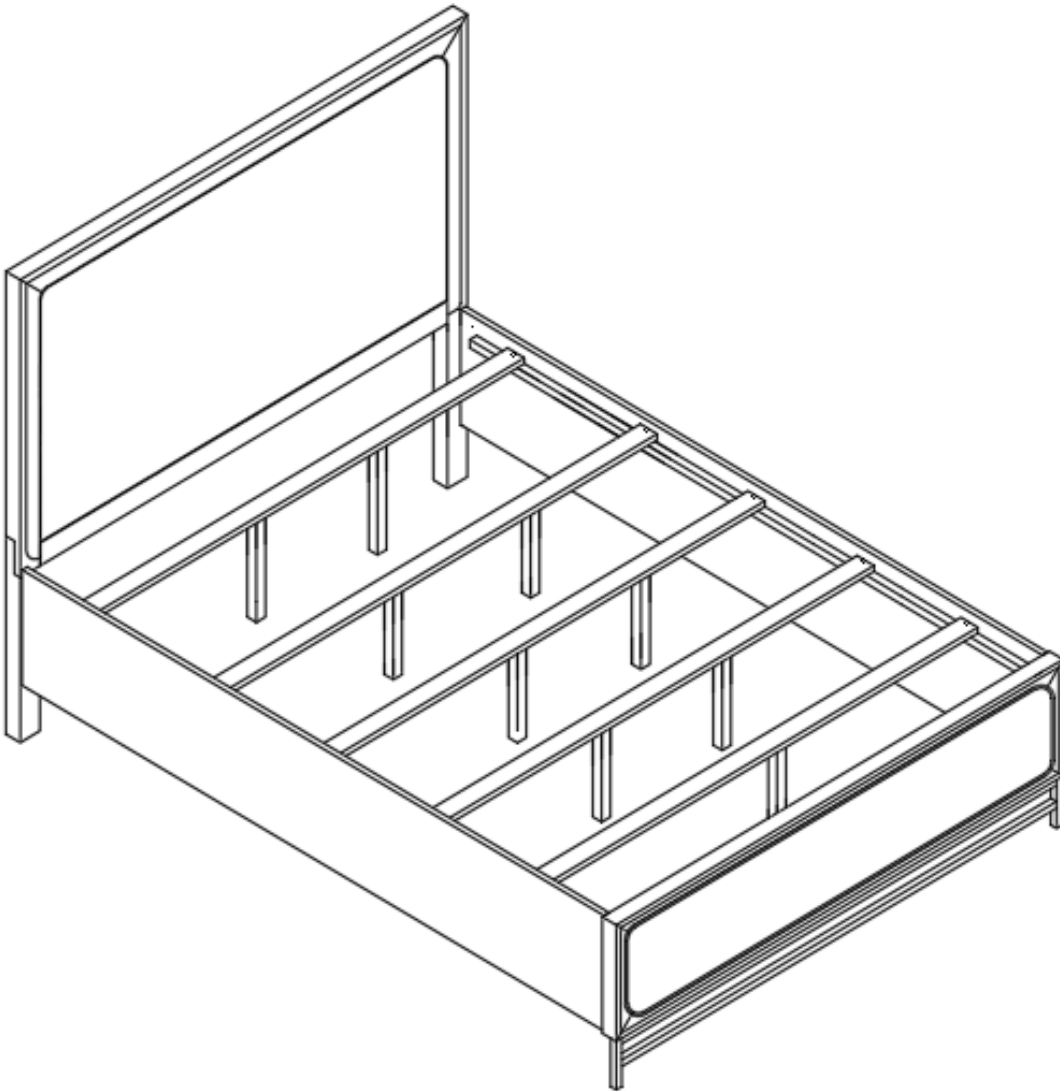
