
# <u>Step 1</u> ⑤ 5x4 ⑥ 4x16

Attach push latch (⑤) to the top panel (A) with screw (④).


### Step 2



Attach the right side board(B), left side board (D) to the top panel(A) with long bolt(1) and flat washer(3). ATTENTION: All the grooves must stay in one side(backside)




Attach the middle clapboard (C) to the top panel(A) with short bolt(2) and flat washer(3).




Insert the back board (F) to the grooves. ATTENTION: Notch facing down.




Insert the slot (G) and back board (E) to the grooves.




Align the bottom panel (H) to the middle clapboard (C), right side board(B) and left side board(D)



Attach the bottom panel (H) to the middle clapboard (C), right side board(B) and left side board(D) with long bolt(1) and flat washer(3).




Fix the middle clapboard (C) with short bolt (2) and flat washer (3). Screw adjustable leveling glide (11) to bottom panel (H).



Stand the mounted sideboard up, and insert shelf support pin (10) into each panel hole.



"Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list? The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust. "
