












Do not place furniture outside . For indoor use only.

Please look in boxes for hardware packs and legs. Sets often ship in multiple boxes and may arrive a day or two apart.



Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-




Save all packaging until finished-

## Assembly Steps



This Barstool has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Barstool parts, the above picture is provided to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Friendly reminder: Tighten all the screws after all holes are installed.




Open the carton, and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Take out Right Front Leg/Left Back Leg (D) and Cross Connector (B) Insert the Cam Lock (③) into the hole of Cross Connector (B), then insert the tenon of the Cross Connector (B) to mortise of the Legs (D) as shown above.

Use Bolt (①) with Allen Wrench (④) to lock it


#### Do Not Fully Tighten the Bolts.



Take out Left Front Leg/Right Back Leg (C). Repeat the installation steps in Step 1 for the Leg (C) as shown above.

Do Not Fully Tighten the Bolts.

### Step 3




Take out the Front Pedal (E), install it on the Front Leg, and use Bolt (2) with Screwdriver (5).

Note that the Pedal (E) is slightly longer than the Pedal (F) and should be installed on the Front Leg at the position where the angle between the Front Leg and the adjacent leg is larger.

Then take out the Back Pedal (F), install it on the Back Leg, and use Bolts (2) with Screwdriver (5).


Do Not Fully Tighten the Bolts.

### Step 4



Take out Left Pedal/Right Pedal (F), install them on the both side of Legs, and use Bolts (②) with Screwdriver (⑤).


Inspect the assembly and make sure all parts are adequately connected. Then tighten all the bolts in Step 1 to Step 4.



Take out Seat (A) and place it face down on a the clean, non-marring surface. Attach the legs frame from step 4 to the Seat (A) with bolt mounting positions aligned, using Bolts (1) with Allen Wrench(4).

Fully Tighten all the bolts.





Stand the Bar Stool up carefully.

Place the Bar Stool on a LEVEL SURFACE to check for wobbling.

Adjust the levelers on the legs to ensure Bar Stool stability.

#### Step 7



Your Barstool is ready for use.

This Barstool can only be used on a flat, level surface.

#### Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
