
Assembly Instructions

Care & Maintenance





- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- Ø ☐ Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.
- Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.
- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- Do not place furniture outside . For indoor use only.
- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.

 Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

Please look in sofa for hardware packs and legs.
Sets often ship in multiple boxes and may arrive a day or two apart.



· Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




· Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-

Assembly Steps




This Sofas has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble.

To give you an overview of the Sofas parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective.


Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Note: It is recommended that you have an adult partner to assist during the entire assembly process.




Remove Seat Board (A), Backrest (B), Headrest (E), Seat Cushion (F), Leg (G), Middle leg (H) and the corresponding hardware bag from Carton 2-1 and place them on a flat surface that is clean and free of squash.

Step 2




Remove Right Armrest (C) and Left Armrest (D) from Carton 2-2 and place them on a flat surface that is clean and free of flatteners.

Step 3




Align the bottom of Seat Board (A) and Backrest (B), and tighten Gaskets (⑤), Spring Shims (③), and Single Head Screw (①) in order using Allen Wrench (⑥), and this step locks Seat Board (A) and Backrest (B).




Align Leg (G) with the two holes at the bottom of Left Armrest (D), and then tighten Gaskets (4), Spring Shims(8) and Single Head Screw (2) in order with Allen Wrench (7).

Do the same for Right Armrest (C).




Lift up Seat Board (A) and snap it into the pins of Right Armrest (C), and in the same steps snap Left Armrest (D) into the pins on the left side of Seat Board (A) as well.

Step 6




Screw Middle leg (H) into the hole at the bottom of Seat Board (A) and tighten Middle leg (H).


Step 7



Tear off the cloth strips on the Velcro of Seat Board (A) and Backrest (B).



Place Seat Cushion (F) and Headrest (E) on the couch.



Your sofa is ready for use.

This sofa should only be used on flat, level surfaces.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

• What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list? The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
