























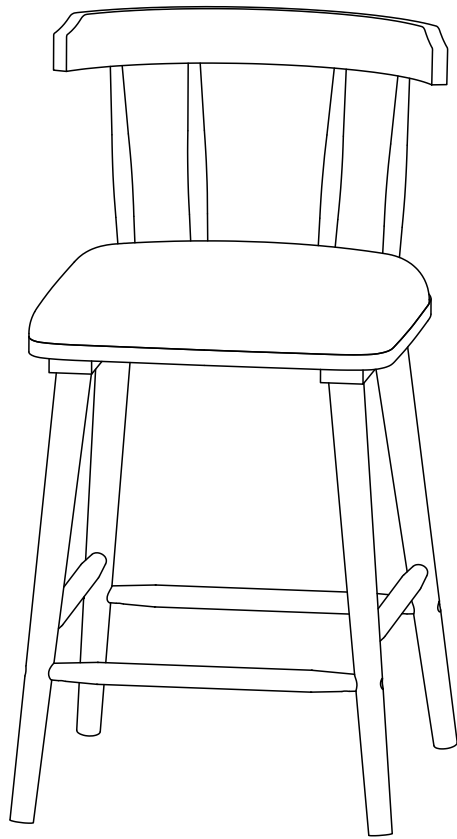



-   ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
-   ● Furniture may scratch floors. We recommend using furniture pads to protect your floors.
-   ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
-   ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
-   ● Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.
-   ● Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.
-   ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
-   ● Do not place furniture outside . For indoor use only.
-   ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
-   ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
-   ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.






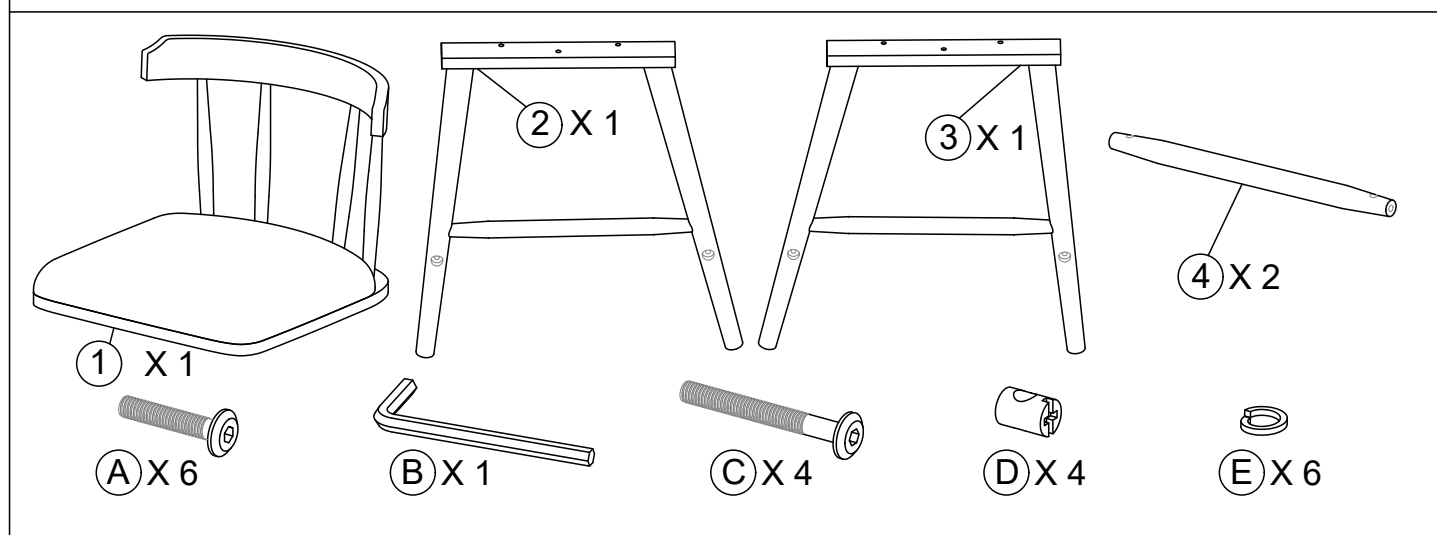

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-



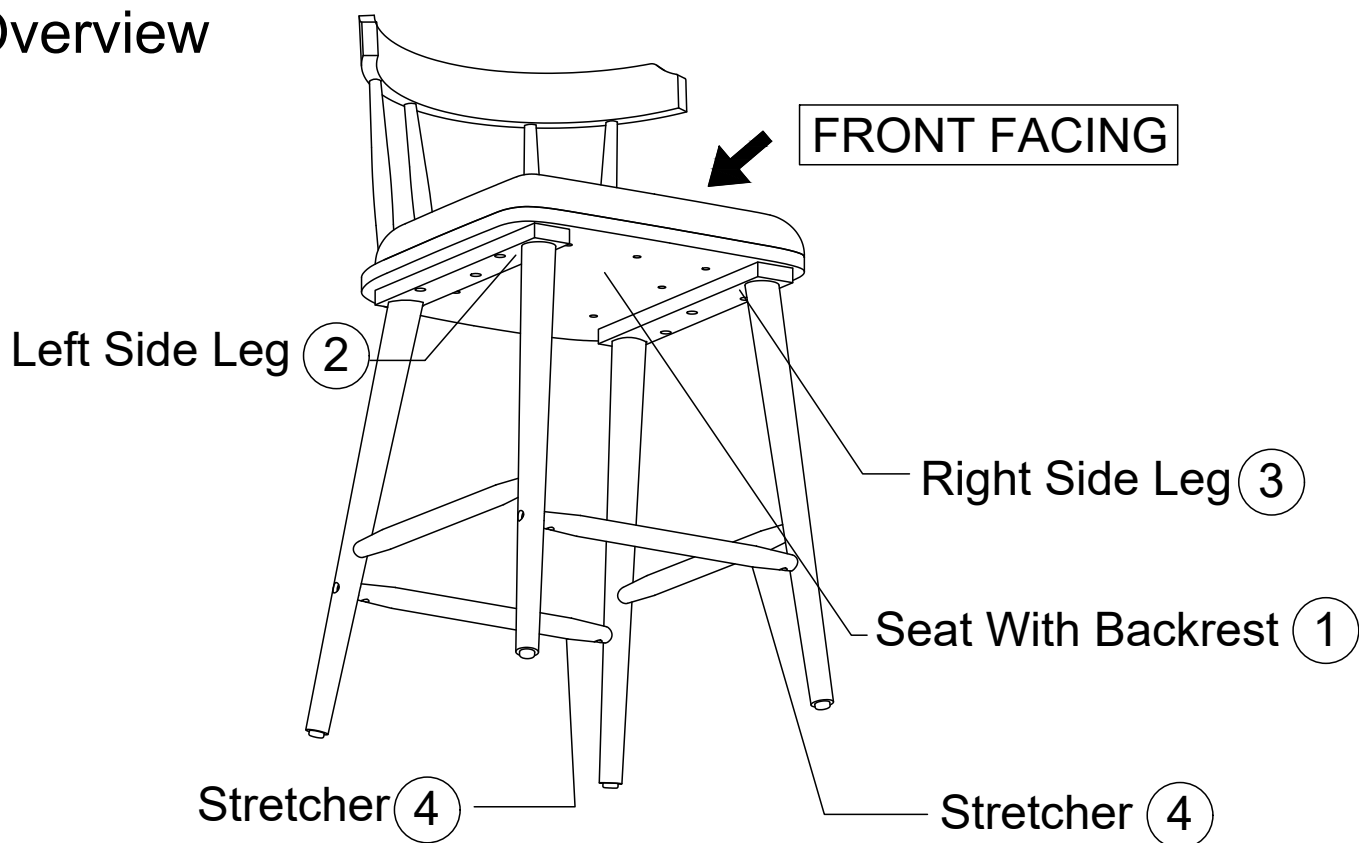
- Assembly on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-

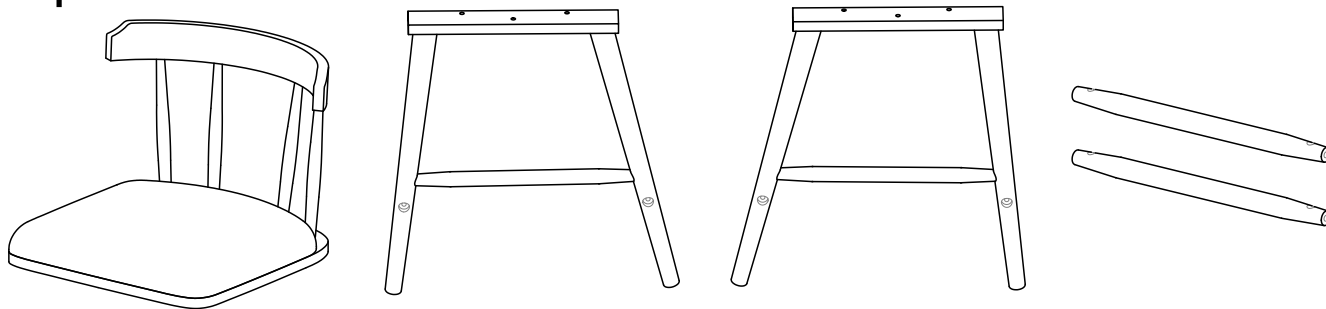
Assembly Steps

Overview



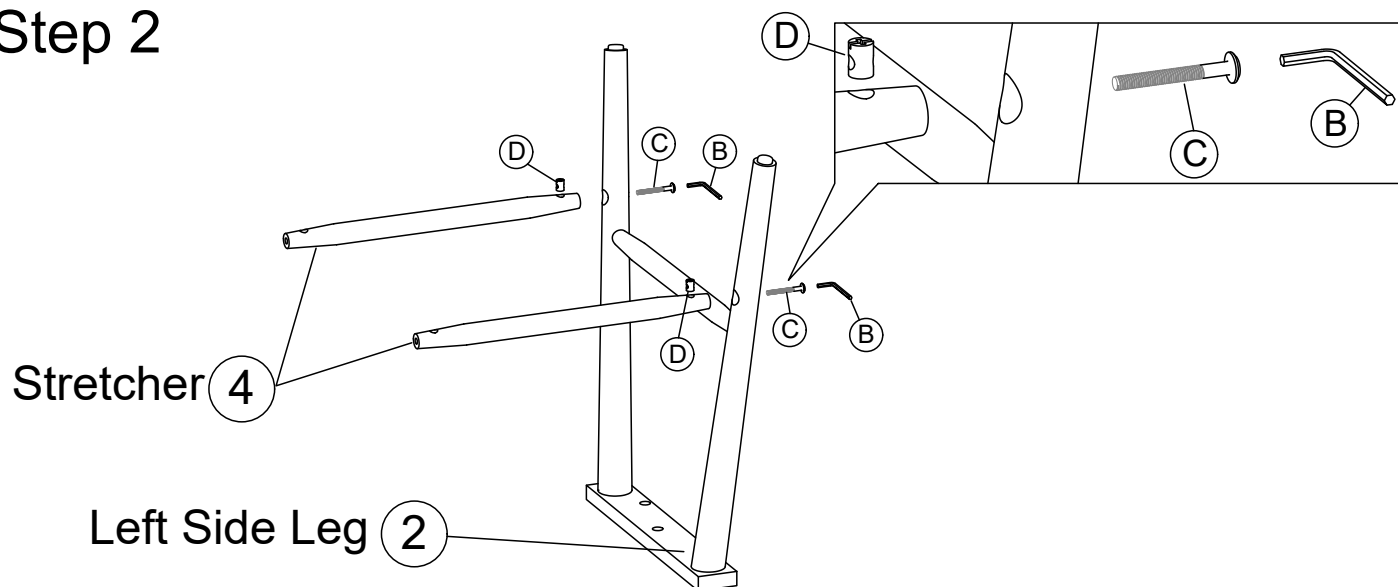
This Windsor stool has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Windsor stool parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarize yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Step 2



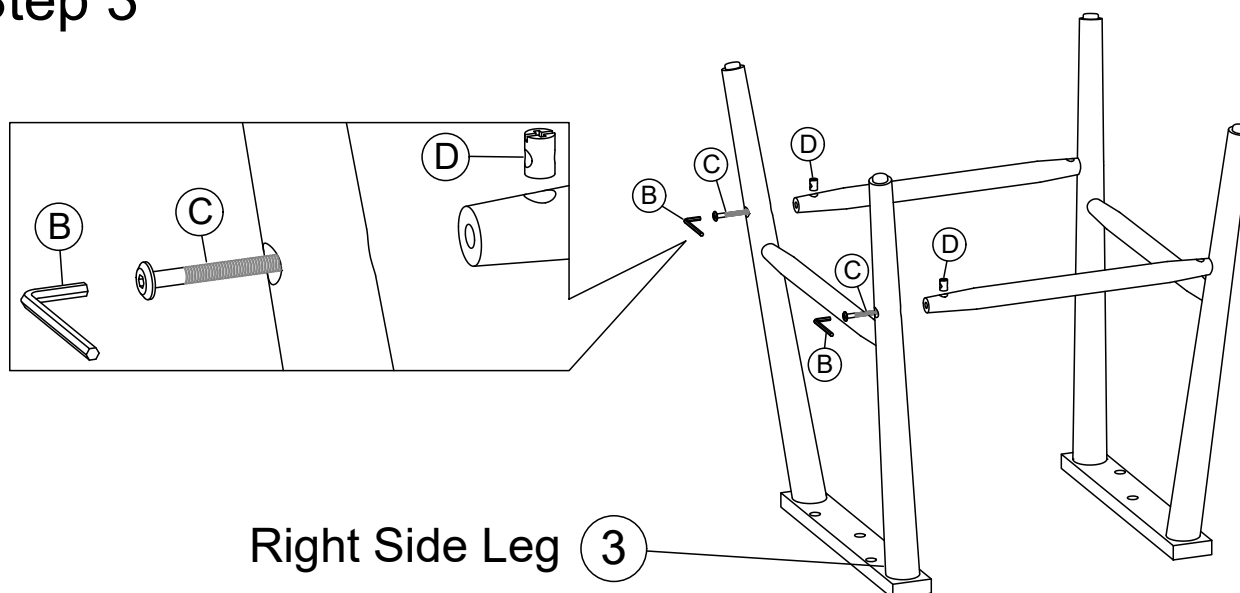
Place the Left Side Leg (2) on a clean, soft surface with the top side facing upward to prevent scratches or damage.

Insert the Stretcher (4) into the mortise of the Left Side Leg (2), as shown in the illustration.

Secure the Left Side Leg (2) to the Stretcher (4) using JCBC Bolt M6 X 60 (C) and Barrel Nut 13mm (D) with the Allen Wrench (B).

Do not fully tighten the bolts at this stage.

Step 3

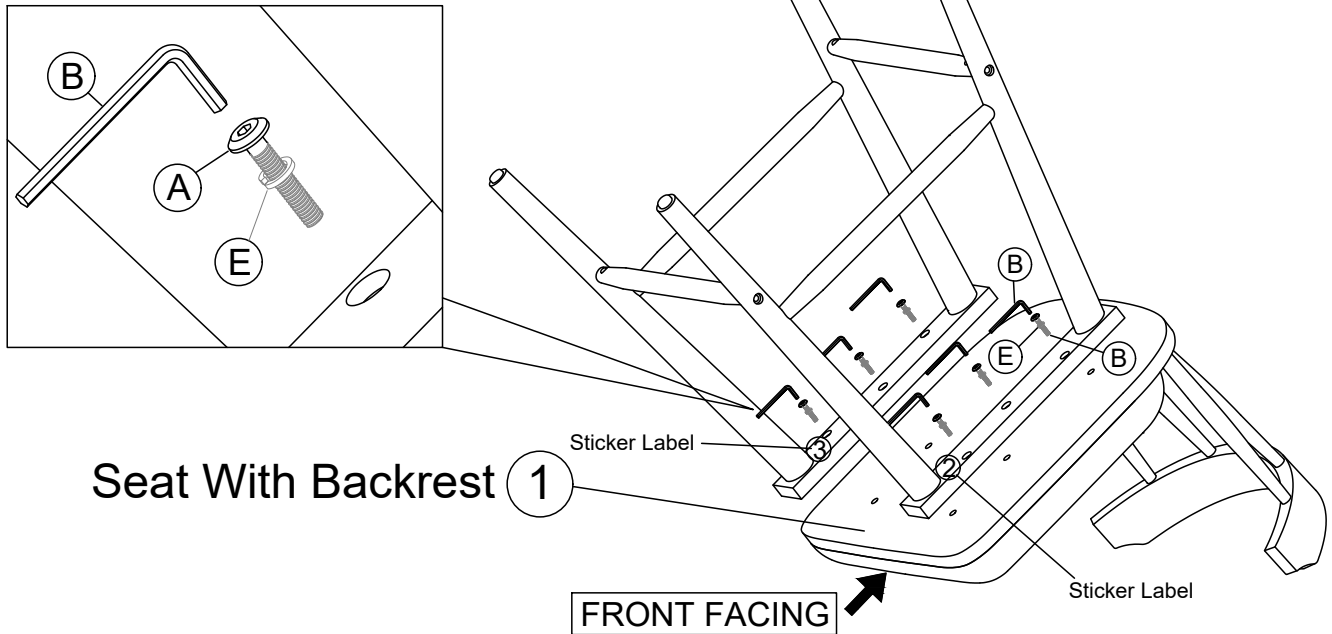


Next, position the Right Side Leg (3) as shown in the illustration above.

Repeat the same process as described in Step 2.

Do not fully tighten the bolts at this stage.

Step 4



Turn the Windsor stool upside down, as shown in the illustration above.

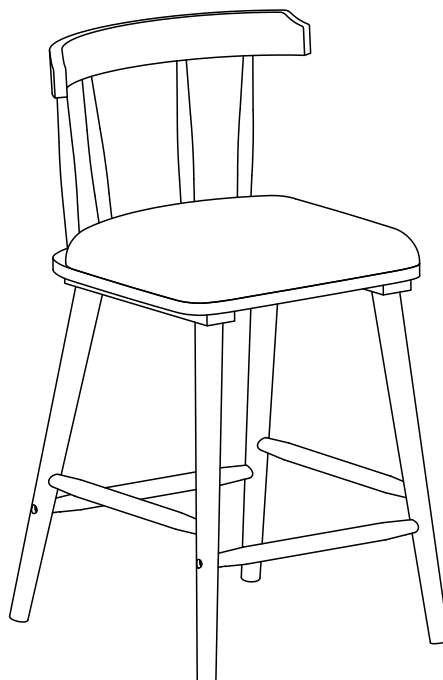
Position the previously assembled Left Side Leg (2) and Right Side Leg (3), ensuring the sticker labels "2" and "3" are facing the front, as shown in the illustration.

Align the bolts holes of the Left Side Leg (2) and Right Side Leg (3) with the corresponding holes on the Seat with Backrest (1).

Secure the legs to the Seat with Backrest (1) using JCBC Bolt M6x35 (A) and Spring Washer (E) with the Allen Wrench (B).

Do not fully tighten the bolts at this stage.

Step 5



Final Assembly & Safety Check

Turn the Windsor stool right side up and place it on a level surface.

Inspect the Windsor stool to ensure all parts are properly connected.

Sit gently on the Windsor stool to help align all joints and connections.

Step off the Windsor stool and, in a sequential manner, proceed to tighten all bolts.

You may need to turn the Windsor stool to access certain bolt points, always turn it carefully and in a synchronized manner with assistance if needed.

CAUTION 1: Tighten all bolts gradually and sequentially.

Do not fully tighten one bolt before moving to the next, as this may cause the frame to warp.

If the stool still wobbles, loosen the bolts slightly and repeat the tightening process.

WARNING: If the Windsor stool is not stable, this may lead to product damage.

Always ensure all bolts are securely locked into position before use.

The Windsor stool is now ready for use.

CAUTION 2: This Windsor stool must only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
