











## **Care & Maintenance**








- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-





## Assembly Steps




This chair has multiple parts and may require up to some 20 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the chair parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

### Step 1




Please use the Allen wrench (③) to loosen the bolt (①) and flat washer (②), and remove the swivel plate (C) assembled under the chair base (B).

### Step 2




Place the chair base (B) on a soft, level surface. Position the swivel plate (C) on top, aligning its four slots. Secure them using the bolt (①), flat washer ring (②), and tighten with the allen key (③).

### Step 3



Place the chair seat (A) and chair base (B) upside down on a soft, protected surface.  
Position the chair base (B) against the bottom of the seat (A). Rotate the base to align the screw holes.  
Insert the bolts (①) with flat washers ring (②) into the holes at both ends of one diagonal. Do not tighten. Rotate the chair base (B) 90°. Insert the bolts (①) with flat washers ring (②) into the holes on the other diagonal. Using the allen key (③), tighten all bolts securely in a cross pattern.

### Step 4



**Your chair is ready for use.**  
**This chair should only be used on flat, level surfaces.**

# Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
