 Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.




Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.






Assembly Steps




This chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. The picture above provides an overview of the chair parts to help you visualize and understand each component. Please read through the instructions below to familiarize yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.




Step 1: Install the stretcher bars (D, E, F) using
Use a screwdriver to fasten screws (7), tightening the stretcher
bars firmly to the chair legs to ensure a stable frame.




Step 2: Attach the two chair lower leg cluster & upper leg cluster (B, C) Position the stretchers correctly using Use a screwdriver to fasten screws (8), tightening the stretcher bars firmly to the chair legs to ensure a stable frame.




Step 3: Attach the four chair railway under(I, J) to the chair frame (B)&(C) using bolts, washers, lock washers, and tighten securely with the Allen Wrench.




Step 4: Attach the one seat frame (A) to the chair frame using bolts, washers, lock washers, and tighten securely with the Allen Wrench.




Step 5: Attach the one railway above (G) to the chair frame (B) & (C) using bolts, washers, lock washers, and tighten securely with the Allen Wrench.



Step 6: Attach the one back cushion (H) to the chair frame using bolts, washers, lock washers, and tighten securely with the Allen Wrench.



Step 7: Attach three covers (9) to the seat frame



The chair is ready for use.

The chair can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

• What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about signicant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals. Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging signicant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was rst published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list? The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.
- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no signicant risk of cancer or is signicantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
