


Care & Maintenance

- ⊘  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
- ✓  ● Furniture may scratch floors. We recommend using furniture pads to protect your floors.

Place the seat cushion assembly (A) with the inside facing up on a clean, soft surface to avoid scratches or damage to the product. With the help of someone, assemble the front crossbar to the front Left Leg (B) and the front Right Leg (C), assemble the rear crossbar to the rear left leg (D) and the rear right leg (E). Secure the assembled assembly with wood screws (4) in the correct positions as shown above. Assemble the left crossbar (H) and the right crossbar (I) to the front leg assembly and the rear leg assembly. Secure the wood screws (4). Finally, assemble the 4-leg assembly into the cushion assembly in the correct position and secure it with the hexagon (1) bolt (5).

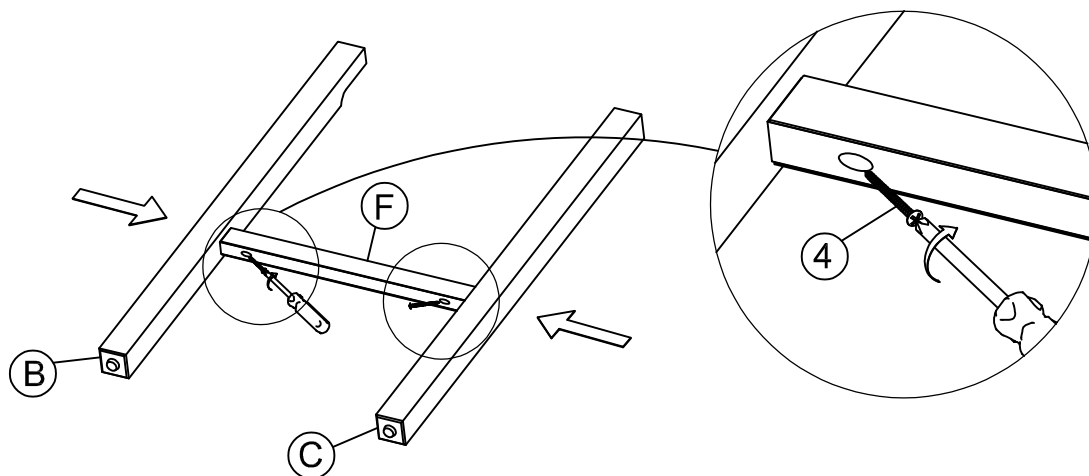
Overview



This Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chair parts, the above picture is provided to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Install the front crossbar (F) to the left (B) and right (C) front legs with wood screws (4)

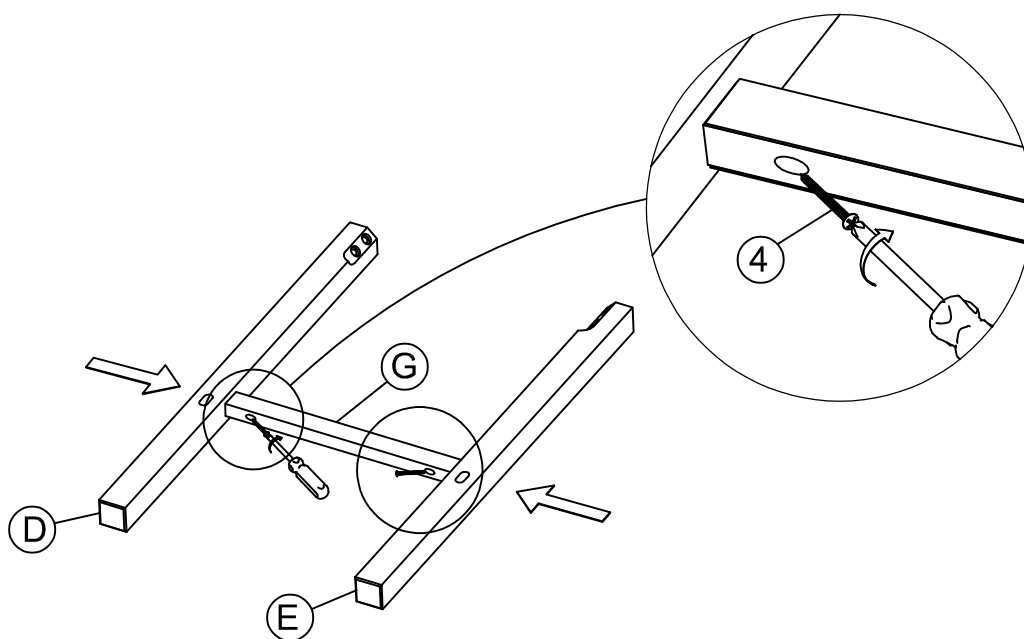

Assemble the front crossbar(G) to the left (D) and right (E) rear legs with wood screws (4)

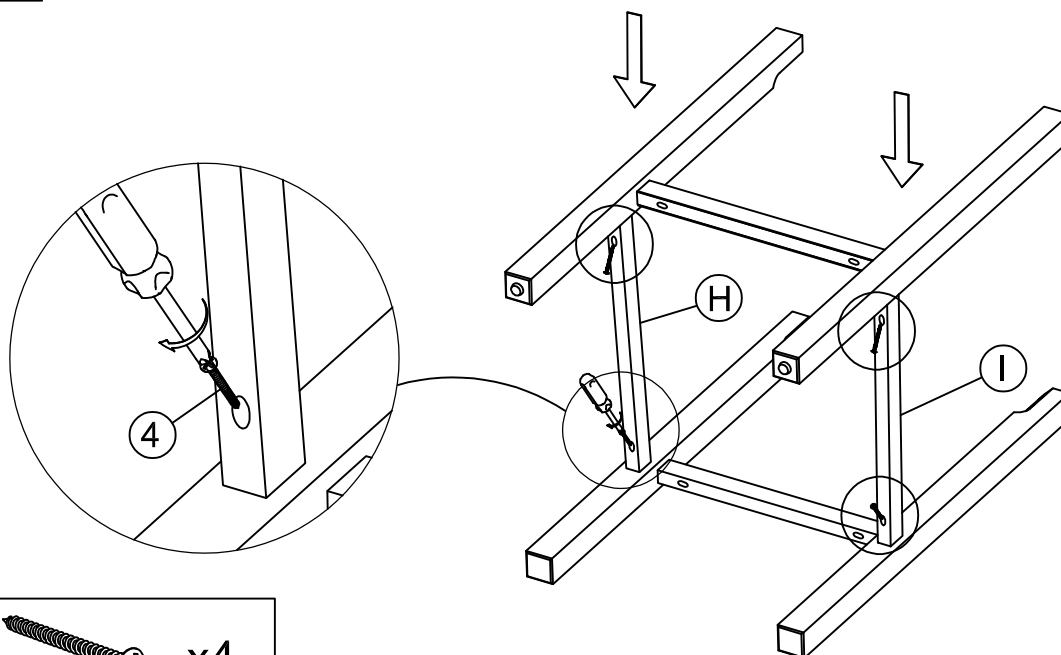

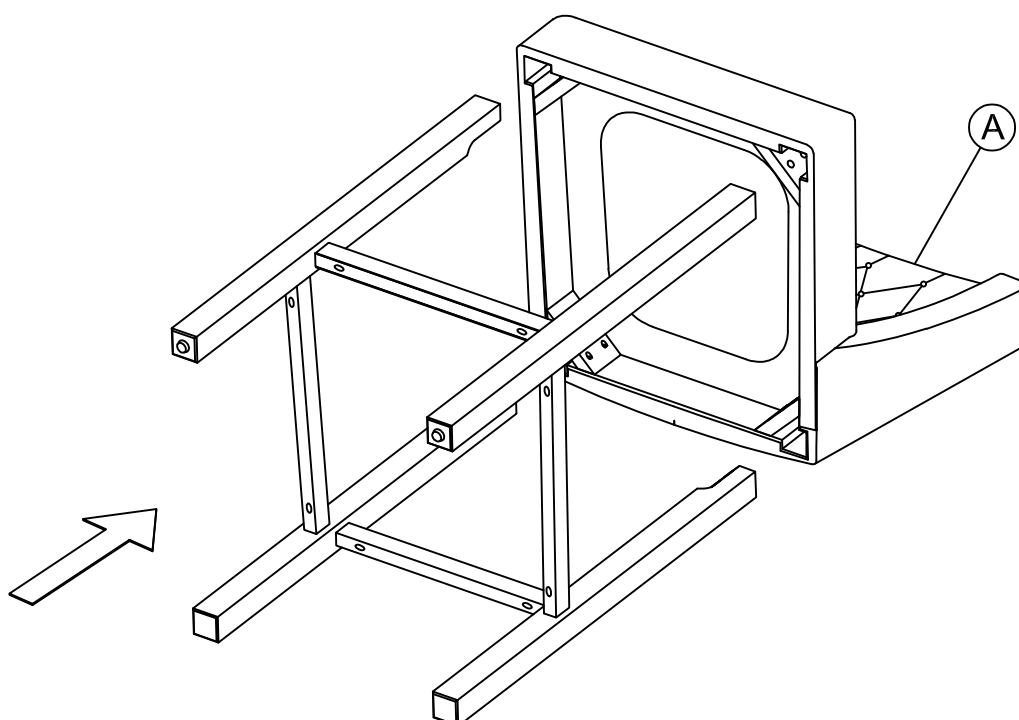

Insert the foot assembly into the seat cushion (A) in the correct front and back positions.

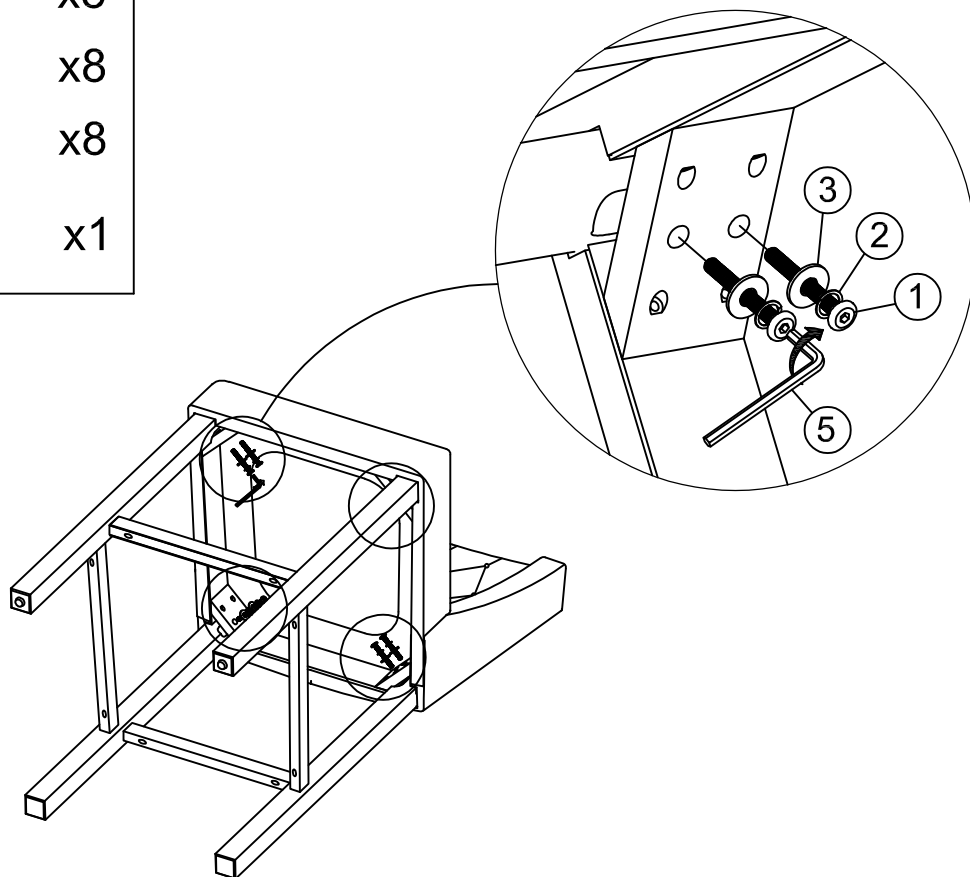

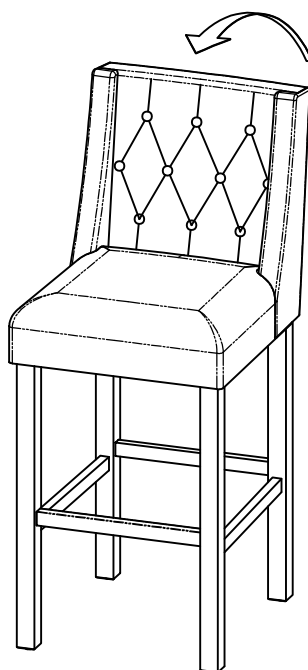
Insert the leg assembly into the seat cushion (A) in the correct front and rear positions, screw 8 M6 bolts (1) into the drilled holes, and tighten with a 4-point hex key.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
