Caution: You must read this before you proceed




SAFETY WARNING

Never adjust chaise lounge or recliner backrest while seated.

Always make sure the backrest is flat before moving the chaise lounge.

Keep all limbs clear from under the backrest when it is in a raised position.

Serious finger, hand, or other bodily injuries may result from adjusting the chaise lounge backrest position while seated.

Care & Maintenance



- Not for commercial use. For residential use only.



- Prolonged exposure to rain may cause rusting which can stain floors



- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.



- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.



- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.




- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.














CAUTION: This Chaise Lounge is NOT a TOY.





①	A standard Phillips head screw with a length of 30mm.	Screws (M6x30mm)	7
②	A standard Phillips head screw with a length of 40mm.	Screws (M6x40mm)	5
③	A standard Phillips head screw with a length of 60mm.	Screws (M6x60mm)	3
④	A hex head bolt with a length of 20mm.	Bolt (M6 x 20mm)	9
⑤	A hex head bolt with a length of 40mm.	Bolt (M6 x 40mm)	5
⑥	A flat plastic washer with an outer diameter of 20mm and a thickness of 2mm.	Flat Washer Plastic (Ø20/6.5 X 2 mm)	3
⑦	A flat steel washer with an outer diameter of 18mm and a thickness of 2mm.	Flat Washer Steel (Ø18/6.5 X 2 mm)	9

Before Beginning Assembly:

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-


Assembly Steps

OVERVIEW



This Chaise Lounge has multiple parts and may require up to some 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chaise Lounge parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.


Step 1



Type equation here.

Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.


Step 2



Place Right Backrest Frame (H), Middle Backrest frame (I), Left Backrest Frame (G) on a clean, non-marring surface
Then attach Upper Backrest Panel (M), Lower Backrest Panel (L) to Right Backrest Frame (H), Middle Backrest frame (I), Left Backrest Frame (G) by using Screws (1) and Allen Wrench (10) as shown above

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time

Step 3




Position the tenon of Verticle Bar (K) to the housing of Horizon Bar (J) as shown above

3.1) Attach the Vertical Bar (K) to Backrest Fame of step 1 by using Bolts (5), Flat Washers Plastic (6) and Allen Wrench (10)

3.2) Attach the Vertical Bar (K) to Horizontal Bar by using Bolts (3) and Allen Wrench (10) as shown above

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time

Step 4




Place Left Side Panel (A), Right Side Panel (B) and Seat Base Panel (C) on a clean, non-marring surface

Attach the Left Side Panel (A) and Right Side Panel (B) to the Seat Base Panel (C) by using Bolts (4), Flat Washers steel (7) and Allen Wrench (10) as shown above

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time


Step 5



Place the assembled part in Step 4 to the right and attach the assembled part in Step 3 to the Left Side Panel (A) and the Right Side Panel (B) by using Flat Washers Plastic (⑧), Bolts (⑤) and Allen Wrench (⑩)

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time


Step 6



With the assistance of your adult partners, position the assembled part in Step 5 as shown above. Then attach 2 pieces of First Support Bar (D) by using Screws (②) and Allen Wrench (⑩) and attach 2 pieces of Second Support Bar (E) to assembled part as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.


Step 7



Place the assembled part in Step 6 on a clean, non-marring surface. Attach 3 pieces of Seat Frame (F) to the assembled part in Step 6 by using Screws (⑨) and the Screw Driver (⑪) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.

Step 8



With assistance from your partner, stand the assembled Backrest Panel from step 8
Lift the headrest part of the Chaise Lounge to the desired position as shown above.

Place the Chaise Lounge on a LEVEL SURFACE.

Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

Gently and gracefully, sit onto the Chaise Lounge.

This will help align all the parts at all joint areas.

Then get off the Chaise Lounge and proceed to tighten the Bolts and Screws in a sequential manner.

When tightening the Bolts and Screws, tighten sequentially.

DO NOT tighten any Bolts and Screws fully and then move on towards the next one.

If there are any wobbles after tightening, loosen the Bolts/Screws and execute this same process.

The Chaise Lounge is ready to be used.

This Chaise Lounge can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
