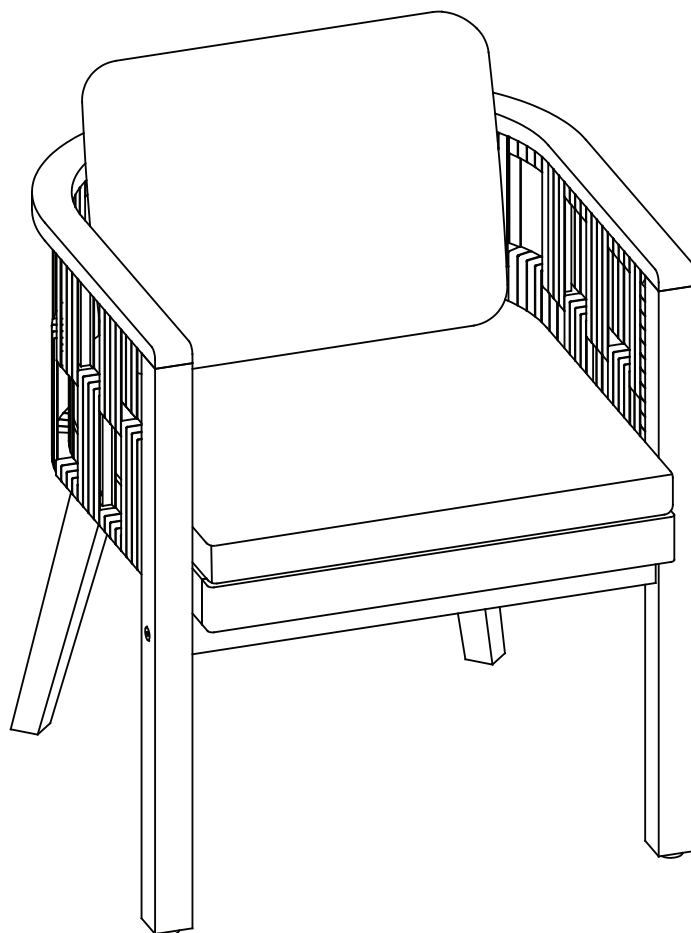
Care & Maintenance

- ⊘  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
- ⊘  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- ⊘  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- ✓  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
- ⊘  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
- ⊘  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- ✓  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
- ⊘  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- ✓  ● Keep away from sources of ignition.
- ✓  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.

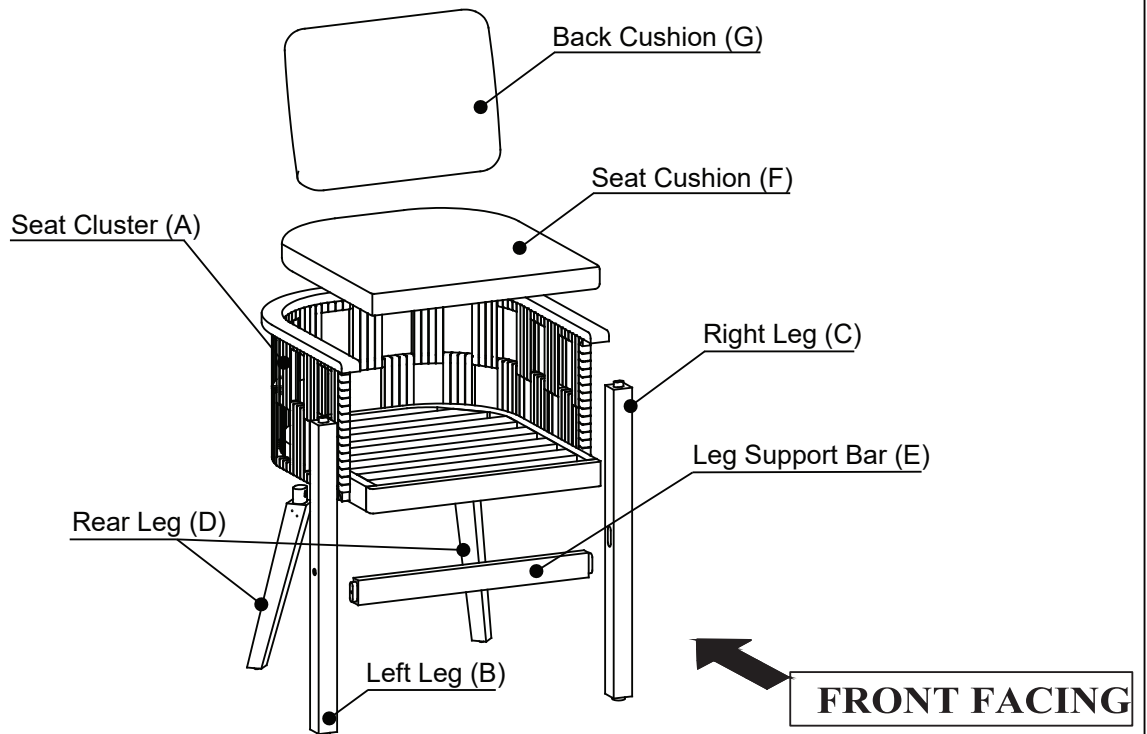
Do not assemble on flooring or carpet.

Save all packaging until finished.

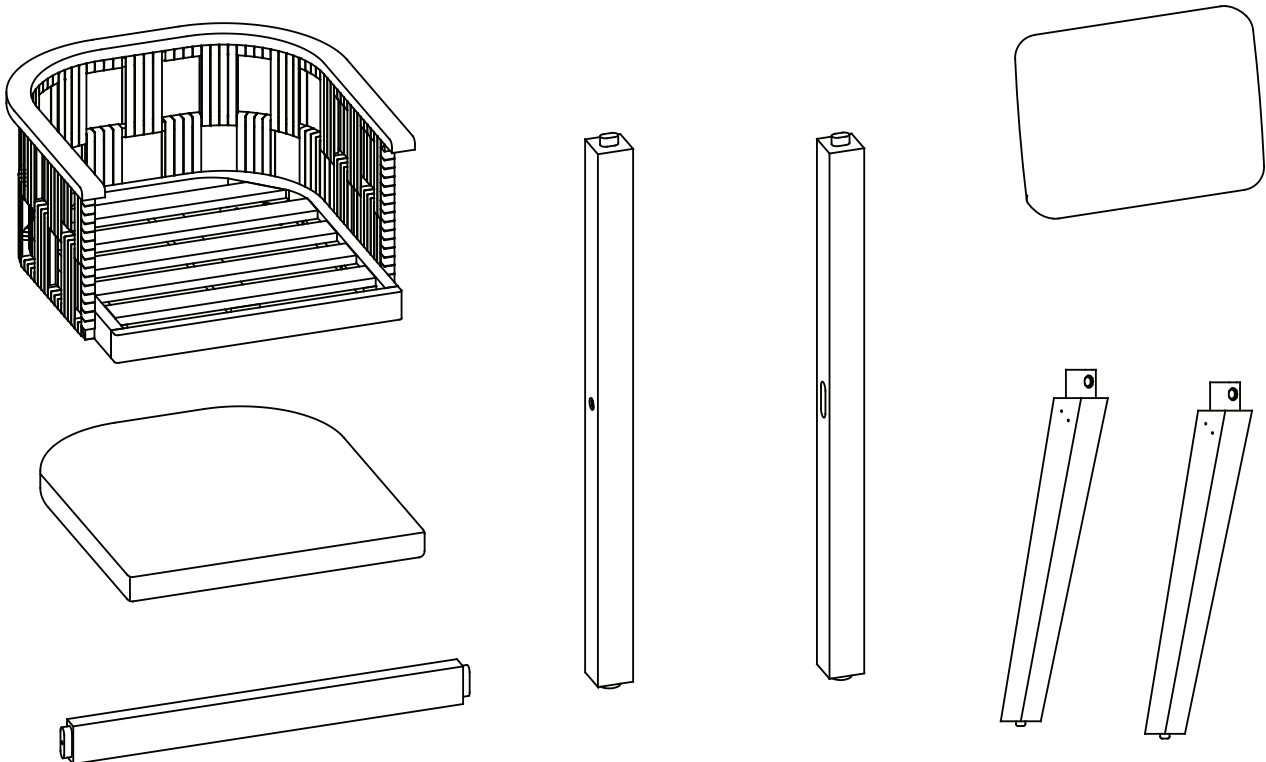
Assembly Steps

OVERVIEW



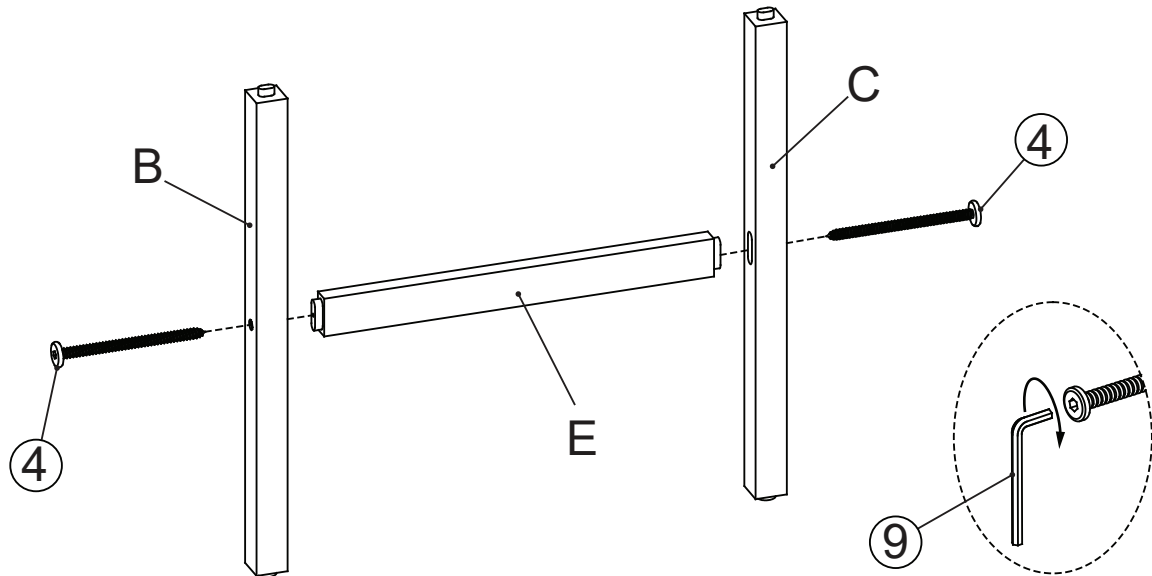
This Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chair parts, we have provided the above picture to put the various parts in perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



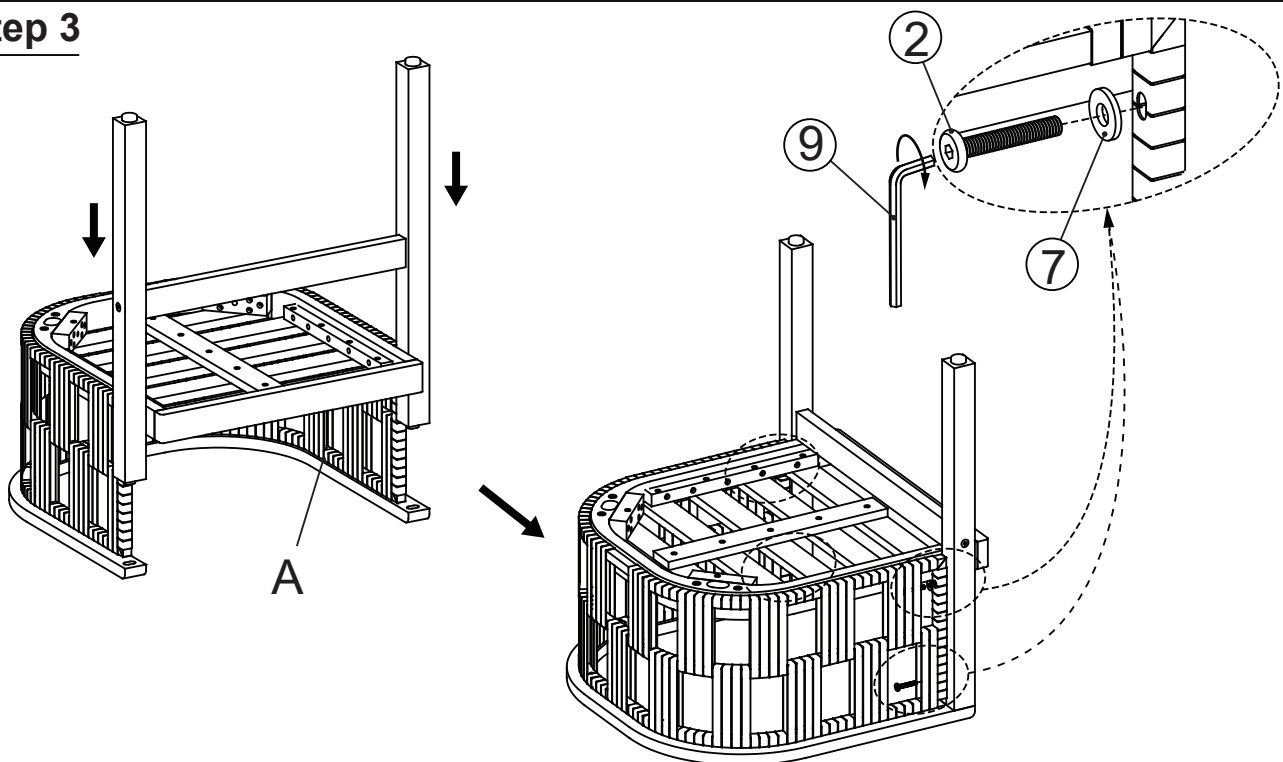
Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Step 2



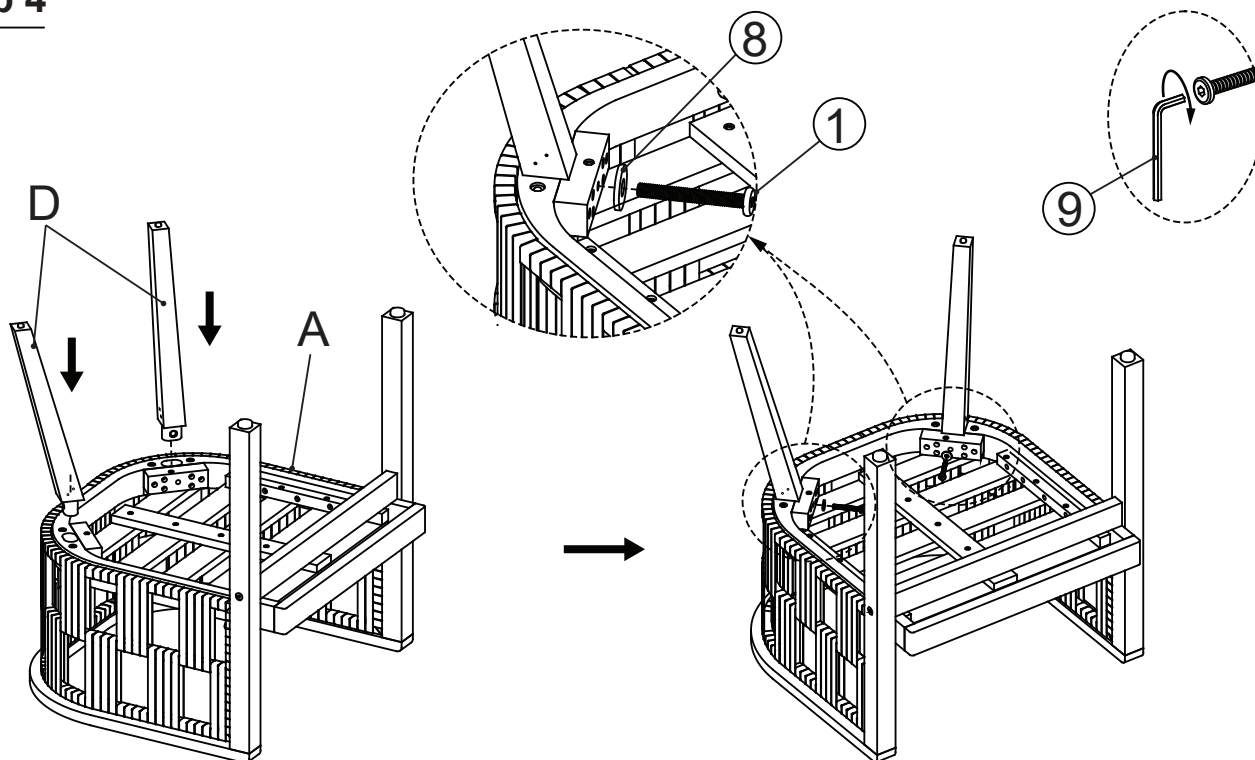
Attach the Leg Support Bar (E) to the Right Leg (C) and Left Leg (B) by using Screws (④) and Allen Wrench (⑨).
DO NOT fully tighten the Screws at this time.

Step 3



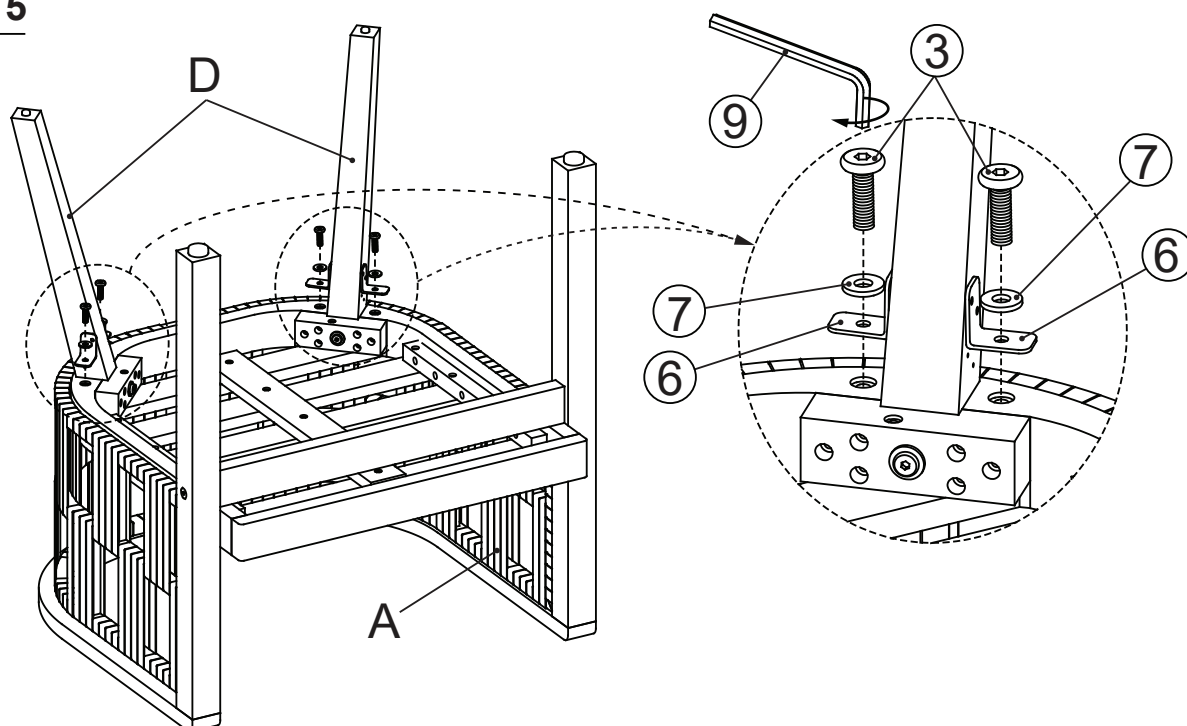
Upside down the Seat Cluster (A) and place it on a clean, non-marring surface. Attach the assembled part in Step 2 to the Seat Cluster (A) by using Bolts (②), Washer Irons (⑦) and Allen Wrench (⑨) as shown above.
DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 4



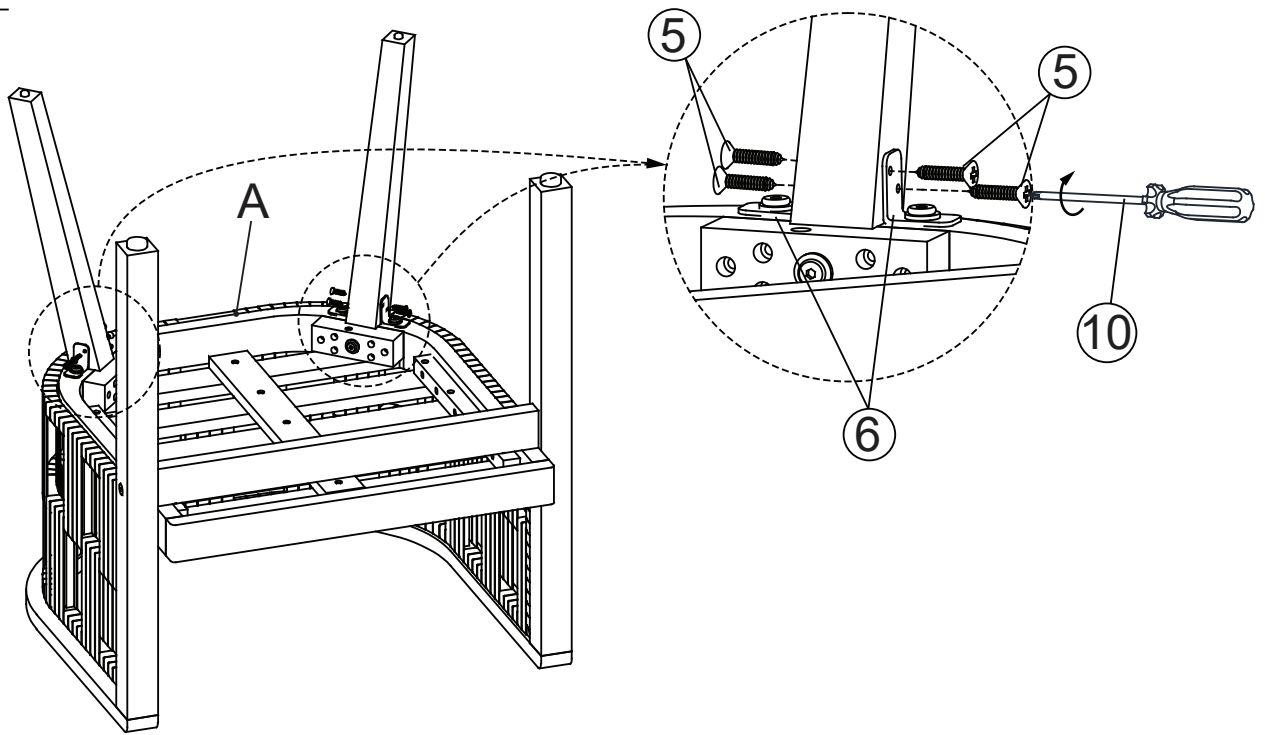
Attach the Rear Leg (D) to the Seat Cluster (A) by using Bolts (①), Washer Irons (⑧) and Allen Wrench (⑨) as shown in the above picture.
DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 5



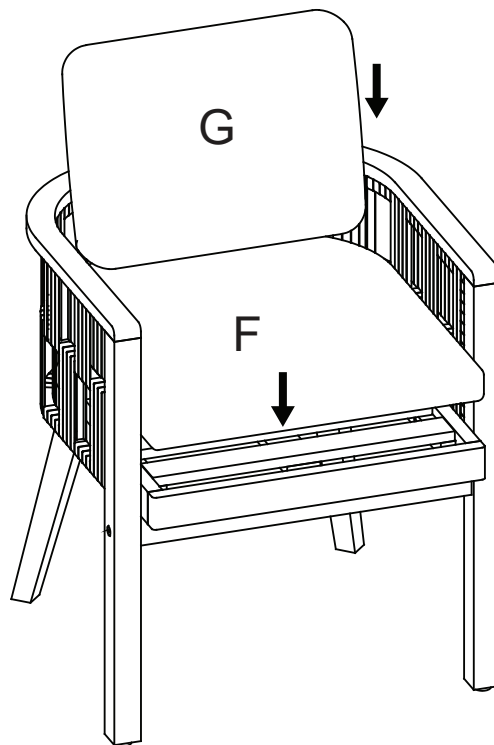
Follow step 4, Attach Rear Leg (D) to the Seat Cluster (A) by using the Iron Corner Brackets (⑥), Washer Irons (⑦), Bolts (③) and Allen Wrench (⑨) as shown in the above picture.
DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 6



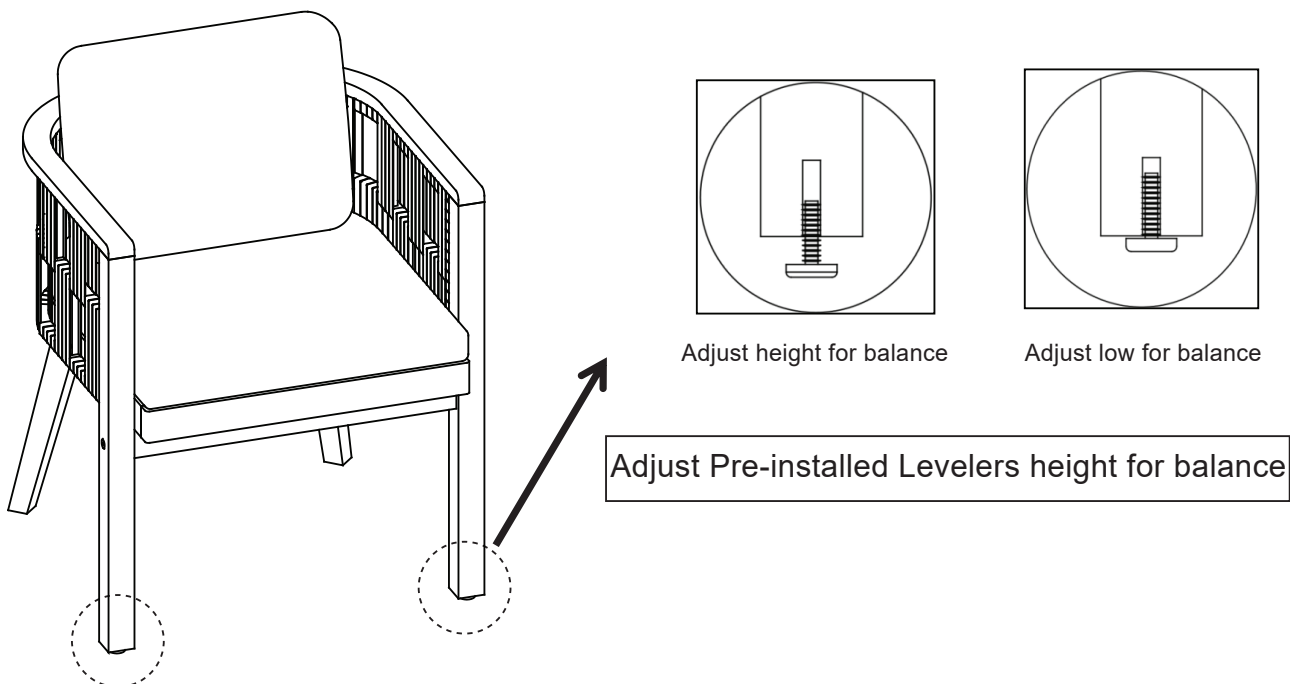
Attach the Iron Corner Bracket (⑥) to the Seat Cluster (A) by using Screws (⑤) and Screw driver (⑩) as shown in the above picture.
DO NOT fully tighten the Screws at this time.

Step 7



Place the Seat Cushion (F) and Back Cushion (G) on the Chair as shown above.

Step 8



Turn the Chair right side up.

Inspect the Chair and make sure all parts are adequately connected.

In a sequential manner, tighten all Screws and Bolts at all joints.

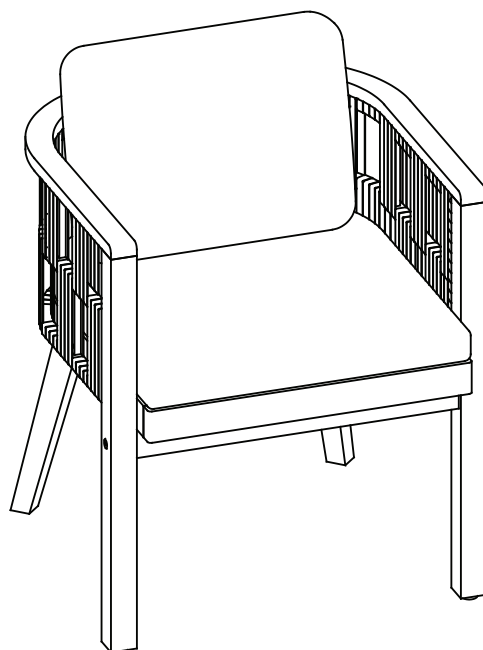
CAUTION: When tightening these screws and bolts, tighten sequentially.

DO NOT tighten any screws or bolts fully and then move towards the next one.

This could cause the frame to warp.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals. Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
