**Caution: You must read these Assembly Instructions before you proceed**

## Care & Maintenance



- Not for commercial use. For residential use only.



- Furniture may scratch floors. We recommend using furniture pads to protect your floors.



- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



- Do not place furniture under direct sunlight.



- Do not place furniture near heating or cooling vents.



- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



- Do not place furniture outside . For indoor use only.



- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.



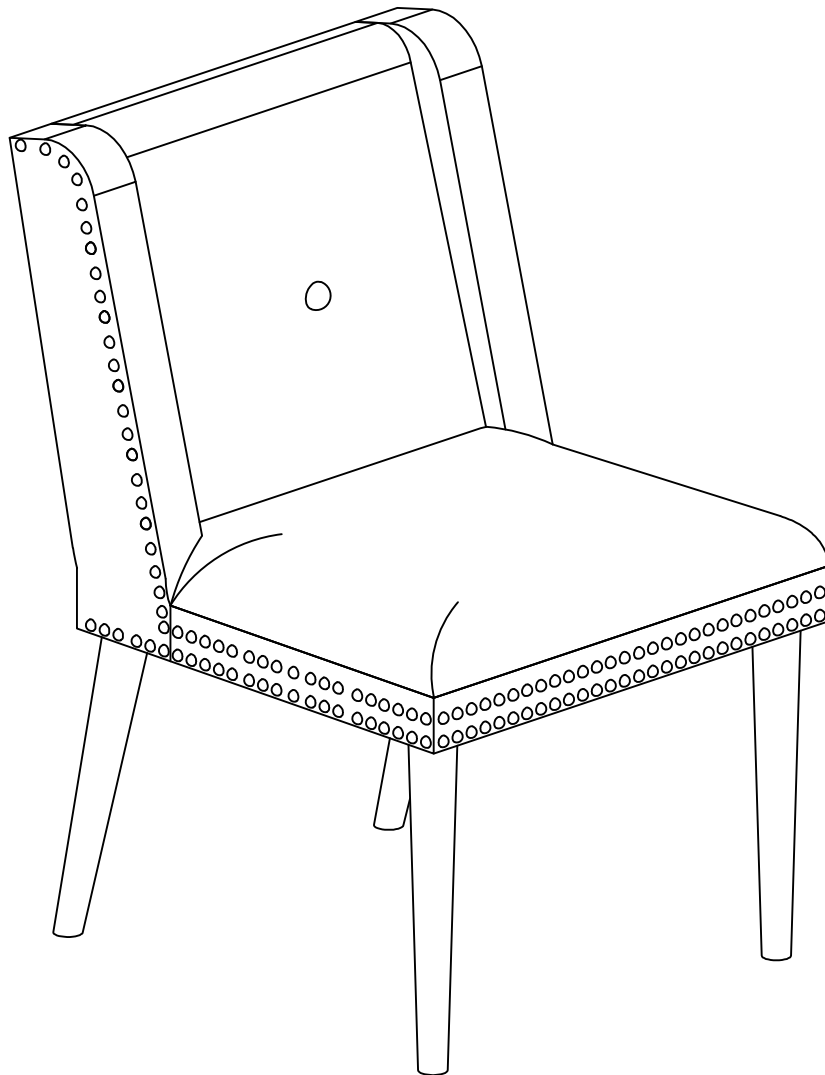
- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.



- Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.



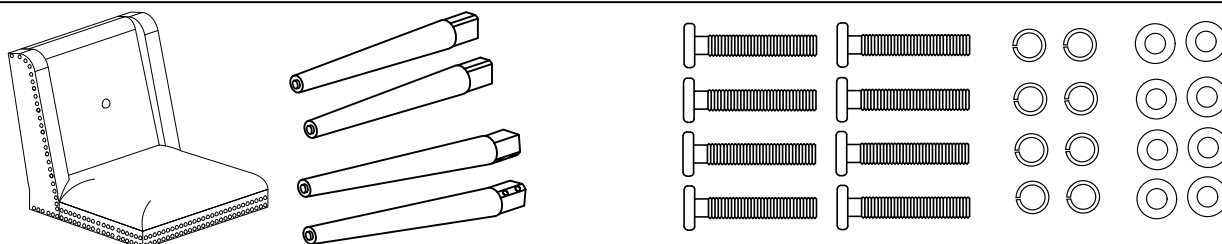

## Assembly Preparation

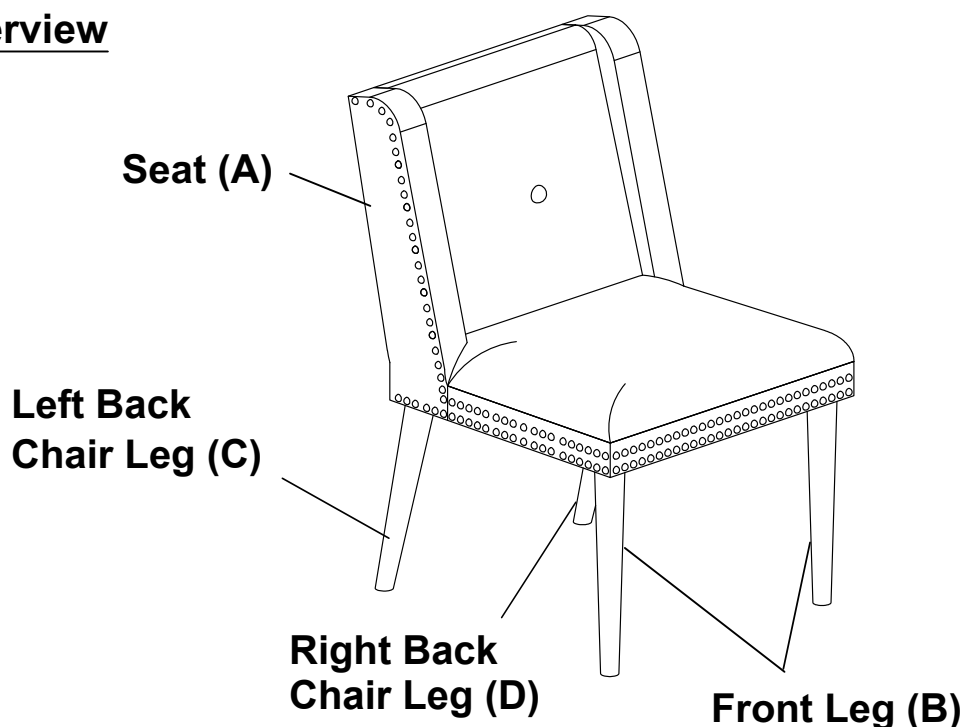
### Before Beginning Assembly:



-  • Read instructions, cover to cover-
-  • Have 2 adults on hand for assembly-
-  • Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-
-  • Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-
-  • Save all packaging until finished-

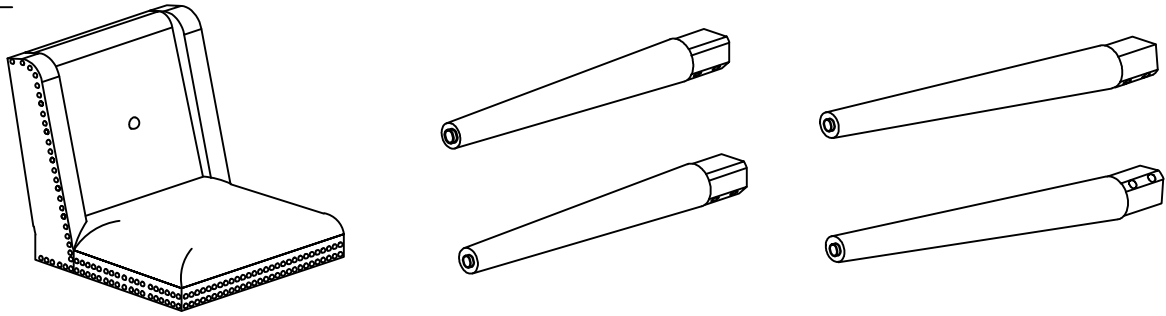
## Assembly Steps

### Overview



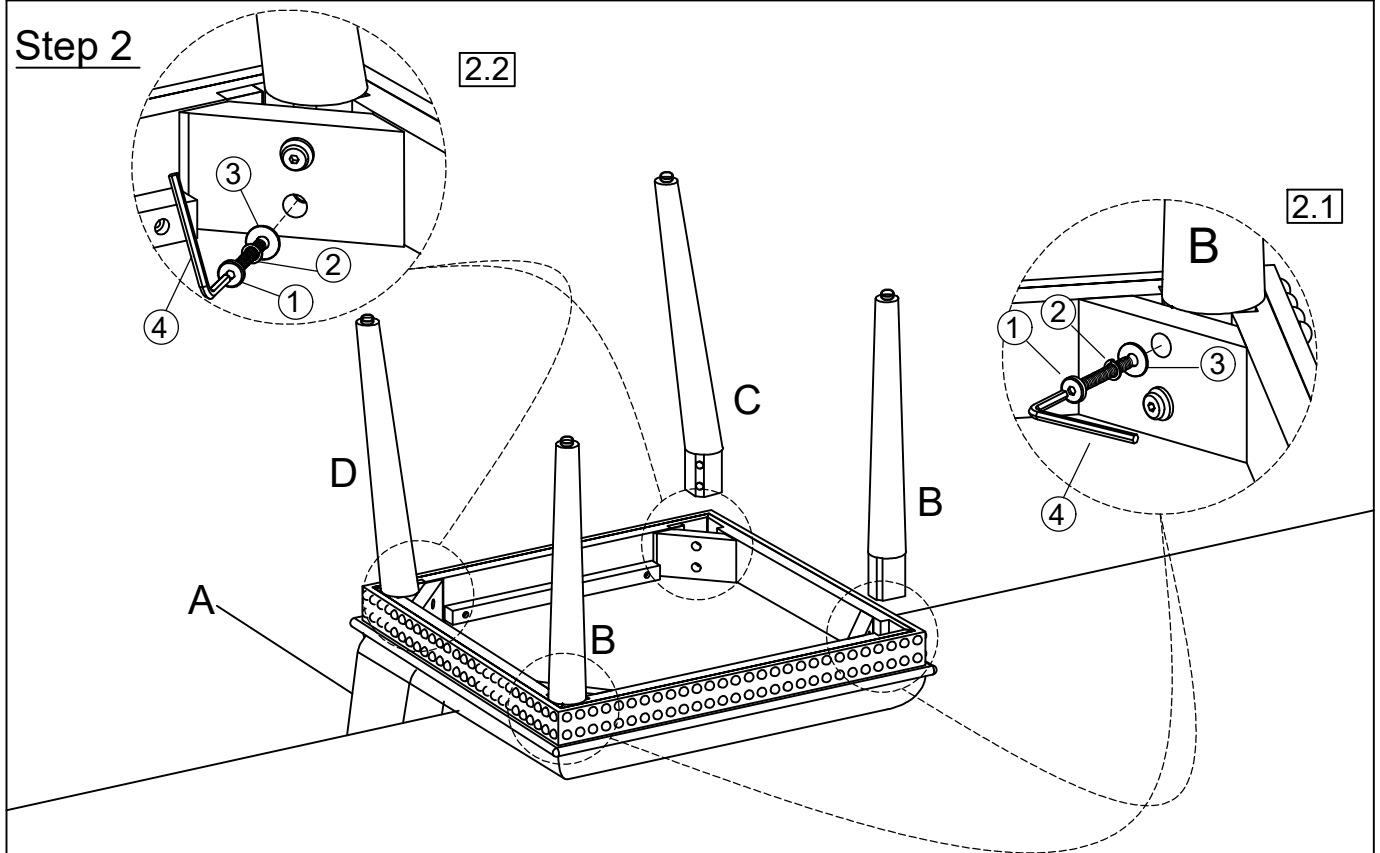
This Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Chair parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instruction below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

## Step 1



Unpack and place all part on a clean, non-marring surface

## Step 2



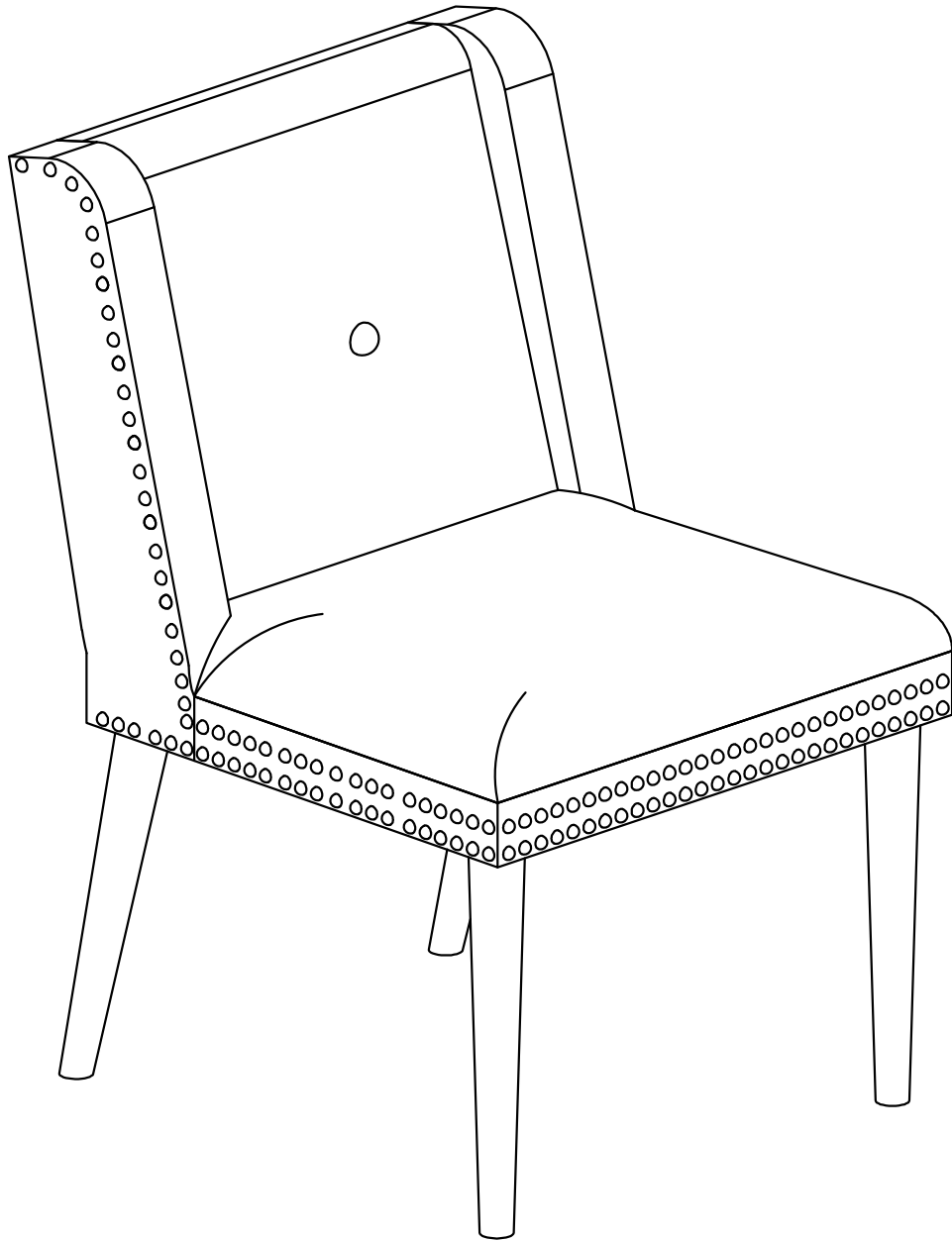
Place the Seat (A) facedown onto a clean, non-marring surface.

2.1: Insert Front Chair Leg (B) into the mountings in the Seat (A). Attach Front Chair Leg (B) using Bolt (1) + Lock Washer (2) + Flat Washer (3) with Allen Wrench (4).

2.2: Insert Left Back Chair Leg (C) + Right Back Chair Leg (D) into the mountings in the Seat (A). Attach Chair Leg (C) + (D) using Bolt (1) + Lock Washer (2) + Flat Washer (3) with Allen Wrench (4).

Do not fully tighten the Bolts

### Step 3



#### 3.1: Tighten the bolts.

Do not tighten one bolt completely and then move on to the next. Instead, tighten each bolt slowly until all of them are tightened. This method ensures that all bolts are fully tightened.

#### 3.2: This chair is for use only on a flat and level surface.

## ”Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust. ”
