
Care & Maintenance

- ⊘  ● Not for commercial use. For residential use only.
- ⊘  ● Prolonged exposure to rain may cause rusting which can stain floors.
- ⊘  ● Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.
- ⊘  ● Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.
- ✓  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.
- ⊘  ● Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.
- ⊘  ● Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.
- ✓  ● To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.
- ⊘  ● Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.
- ✓  ● Keep away from sources of ignition.
- ✓  ● Dust and pick-up spills using a clean, non-colored, lint-free cloth.


Before Beginning Assembly

-  • Save all packaging until finished-


Assembly Steps

OVERVIEW




This Swivel Chair has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Swivel Chair parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into Swivel Chair perspective. Please read through the instructions below to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.


Step 2



With assistance from your adult partners, place the Leg Frame (F) onto a clean, non-marring surface, then attach the Swivel Base (G) by using the Bolts ①, Washers ④ and the Allen Wrench ⑤.

DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts at this time.


Step 3



Place the Seat Panel (E) onto a clean, non-marring surface and upside down the assembled part in Step 2, Then attach to the Seat Panel (E) by using Bolts ①, Washers ④ and Allen Wrench ⑤.

DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts at this time.


Step 4



Upside down the assembled part in Step 3 onto the surface, then attach to the Backrest Panel (A) by using Bolts ③, Washers ④ and Allen Wrench ⑤.

DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 5



Attach the Right Armrest (B) to the assembled part in Step 4


5.1: Attach the Right Armrest (B) to the Backrest Panel (A) by using Bolts ①, Washers ④ and Allen Wrench ⑤ as shown above

5.2: Attach the Right Armrest (B) to the Seat Panel (E) by using Bolts ③, Washers ④ and Allen Wrench ⑤ as shown above




Attach the Left Armrest (C) to the assembled part in Step 5


6.1: Attach the Left Armrest (C) to the Backrest Panel (A) by using Bolt ① Washer ④ and Allen Wrench ⑤ as shown above.

6.2: Attach the Left Armrest (C) to the Seat Panel (E) by using Bolts ③, Washers ④ and Allen Wrench ⑤ as shown above.







Attach the Front Panel (D) to the assembled part in Step 6

7.1: Attach the Front Panel (D) to the Right Armrest (B) and the Left Armrest (C) by using Bolts ③, Washers ④ and Allen Wrench ⑤ as shown above.

7.2: Attach the Front Panel (D) to the Seat Panel (E) by using Bolts ② Washers ④ and Allen Wrench ⑤ as shown above.

DO NOT fully tighten the Bolts at this times.


Adjust height for balance Adjust low balance

With assistance from your adult partners, turn the Swivel Chair back to normal flat ground. Place the Seat Cushion (I) and the Backrest Pillow (H) onto the Swivel Chair as shown above. Place the Chair on a LEVEL surface. Inspect it and make sure all parts are adequately connected. Gently and carefully sit onto the Chair. This pressure will help to align all the parts at all joint areas. Check for wobbles on a LEVEL surface. If no wobbles are found, proceed to tighten the Bolts and Screws in a sequential manner, until evenly secured. Adjust the Levelers until the Chair is level with the ground. To adjust the Levelers, get assistance from an adult partner to lift/lean and hold the Chair while you are working.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals. Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
