Care & Maintenance



- Not for commercial use. For residential use only.



- Do not put hot items directly on furniture surface.



- Do not clean furniture with harsh cleansers or polish.



- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, minimizing exposure to direct sunlight is recommended.



- Children should not climb or jump on the furniture.



- Do not write on furniture without a padded barrier to protect the surface.



- To obtain the longest lifespan of your outdoor products, avoid extended and lengthy exposure to rain, snow, and direct sunshine. Whenever possible cover the product and /or place under patio or awnings.




- Stains may be removed with mild soap solution and damp cloth.

- Do not assemble on flooring or carpet-




- Assemble on a clean non-marring surface (packing foam)-



- Save all packaging until finished-


Assembly Steps

Overview




This Table has multiple parts and may require up to 30 minutes to assemble. To give you an overview of the Table parts, the above picture is to help you put the various parts into perspective. Please read through the instructions herebelow to familiarise yourself with the parts and steps before assembly.

Step 1



Unpack and place all parts on a clean, non-marring surface.

Step 2




Place the Back Table Vertical Bar (F), the Front Table Vertical Bar (G), the Table Horizontal Bar (H) and the Support Table Top (L) on a clean, non-marring surface.

Position tenon of the Support Table Top (L) to housing of the Back Table Vertical Bar (F) and the Front Table Vertical Bar (G) as shown above.

Attach the Table Horizontal Bar (H) to the Back Table Vertical Bar (F) and the Front Table Vertical Bar (G) by using Bolts (1) and Allen Wrench (4) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Bolts at this time.

Step 3




Place the Conner Block (M) and the assembled parts from step 2 on non-marring surface.

Attach the Conner Block (M) to the assembled parts in step 2 by using Screw (2) and Allen Wrench (4) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time.

Step 4




Place the Table Top 1(I), the Table Top 2 (J), the Table Top 3 (K) and the assembled parts from step 3 on a clean, non-marring surface

Attach the Table Top 1(I), the Table Top 2 (J), the Table Top 3 (K) to the assembled frame in step 3 by using Screws (2) and Allen Wrench (4) as shown above.

Do not fully tighten the Screws at this time


Step 5



Place the Left Legs (A), the Right Legs (B) and the assembled parts from step 4 as shown above.


Attach the Left Legs (A) and the Right Legs (B) to the assembled parts in step 4 by using Bolts (1) and Allen Wrench (4) as shown above

Step 6




Position the tenon of Support Legs (C) into the Left Legs (A) and the Right Legs (B) in step 5 as shown above

Step 7




Position the tenon of Support Legs (C) into the Left Legs (A) and the Right Legs (B) as step 6. Then attach the Right Legs (B) and the Left Legs (A) to the assembled parts in step 6 by using Bolts (①) and Allen Wrench (④) as shown above
Do not fully tightening Bolts at this time

Step 8



Place the assembled parts from step 6, the Conner Block 1 (D) and the Conner Block 2 (E) as shown above.
Attach the Conner Block 1 (D) and Conner Block 2 (E) to the Support Legs (C), the Left Table Vertical Bar (F) and the Right Table Vertical Bar (G) in step 2 by using Bolts (①), Allen Wrench (④), Screws (③) and Screw Driver (⑤) as shown above
Do not fully tightening Screws and Bolts at this time

Step 9



Turn the Table back to normal flat ground
EXERT pressure, floorwards, onto the Table.
This pressure will help the Legs and Table Top reach alignment at all joints.
Check for wobbles.

CAUTION : When tightening these screws and bolts, tighten sequentially.

DO NOT tighten any screw or bolt fully and then move towards the next one. This could cause the frame to warp.

WARNING!! IF THE TABLE IS NOT STABLE , IT COULD LEAD TO DAMAGING THE PRODUCT.

The Table is ready for use.

CAUTION: The Table can only be used on a flat, level surface.

Questions & Answers about Proposition 65

- What is Proposition 65?

Proposition 65 requires businesses to provide warnings to Californians about significant exposures to chemicals that cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. These chemicals can be in the products that Californians purchase, in their homes or workplaces, or that are released into the environment. By requiring that this information be provided, Proposition 65 enables Californians to make informed decisions about their exposures to these chemicals.

Proposition 65 also prohibits California businesses from knowingly discharging significant amounts of listed chemicals into sources of drinking water.

Proposition 65 requires California to publish a list of chemicals known to cause cancer, birth defects or other reproductive harm. This list, which must be updated at least once a year, has grown to include approximately 900 chemicals since it was first published in 1987.

- What types of chemicals are on the Proposition 65 list?

The list contains a wide range of naturally occurring and synthetic chemicals that include additives or ingredients in pesticides, common household products, food, drugs, dyes, or solvents. Listed chemicals may also be used in manufacturing and construction, or they may be byproducts of chemical processes, such as motor vehicle exhaust.

- What does a warning mean?

If a warning is placed on a product label or posted or distributed at a workplace, a business, or in rental housing, the business issuing the warning is aware or believes that it is exposing individuals to one or more listed chemicals.

By law, a warning must be given for listed chemicals unless the exposure is low enough to pose no significant risk of cancer or is significantly below levels observed to cause birth defects or other reproductive harm.
